The Prevention Continuum







Approaches that take place **BEFORE**

violence has occurred to prevent initial perpetration or victimization

Immediate

responses AFTER

violence has occurred to deal with the consequences in the short-term Long-term responses



violence to deal with the lasting consequences and treatment interventions



Early intervention and awareness building are NOT primary prevention

Policy and Legislation



Useful policy is often developed locally.



Local Policy is Critical

4 of 10 reasons

• Local policies can be *tailored* to individual community needs.

- Local initiatives *raise community awareness* and support.
- Local communities are *not burdened with bureaucracy* that often inhibits progress at the state and national levels.
- Local initiatives are a *laboratory for broader policy change*, providing valuable clues to the most effective and appropriate models.
