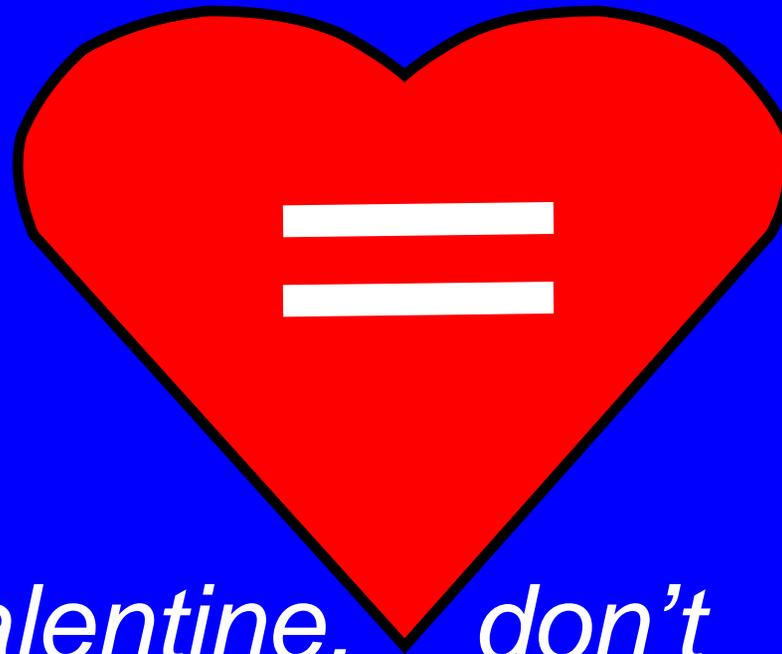

Searching Strategy Essentials

Searching Basics

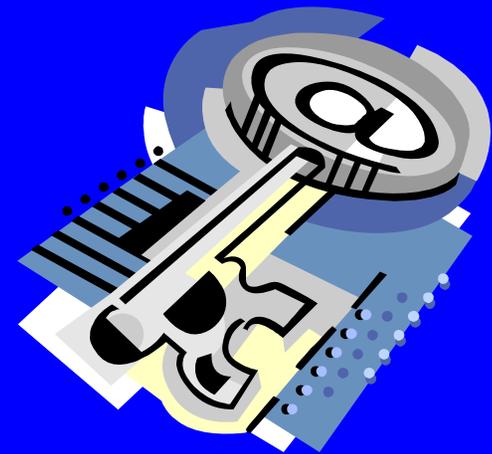
Before you start:

- Define key concepts
 - Consider media format, dates & source
 - Use keywords & related terms
- Select database
 - Choose a database that covers the topic
 - Note provided searching aids (thesaurus, etc.)



Determining keywords

- Define concept
- Determine alternate keywords
- Remember:
 - discipline
 - time
 - professional or general public



Searching Technique

- GOAL: combine keywords in database to get relevant results
- RECALL vs PRECISION
 - Recall: Proportion of relevant documents retrieved from entire database
 - VS
 - Precision: Proportion of retrieved documents that are relevant

“THE PERFECT SEARCH”

ALL the relevant materials, and ONLY the relevant materials would be retrieved from the database

“THE PERFECT SEARCH”.....

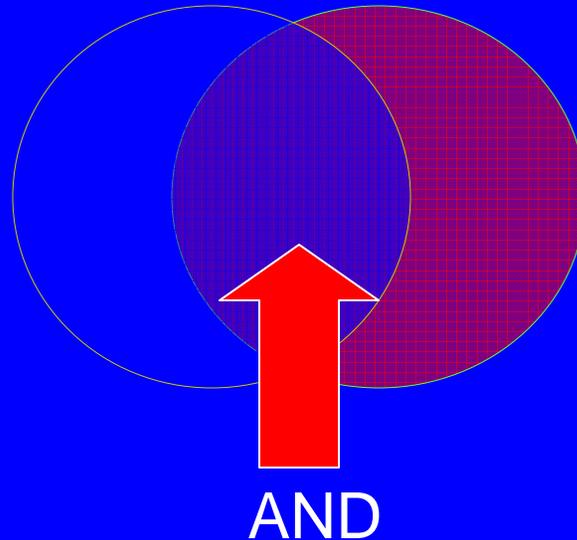
.....is impossible!

But we can try!!!

BOOLEAN Searching

- Most common searching tool
- Simple (and advanced) way to combine concepts

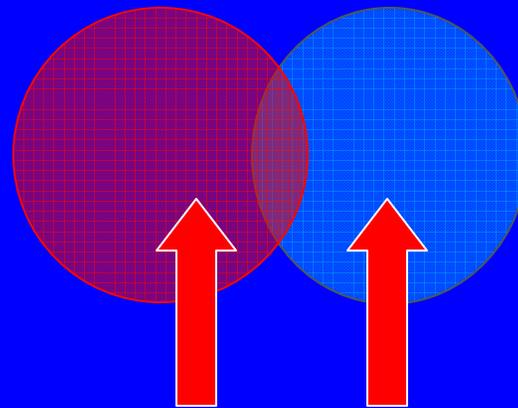
Boolean: AND



Record must contain BOTH words
Use for searching for different concepts

cats AND dogs

Boolean: OR

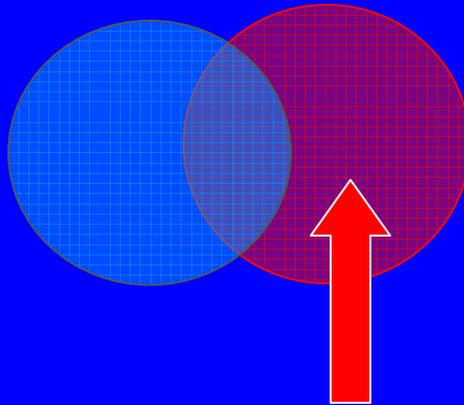


OR

Record can contain EITHER word
Use when searching for similar concepts

cats OR felines

Boolean: NOT



NOT

Record CANNOT contain word
Use to eliminate words with different meanings

canines NOT teeth

Nested Boolean

- Advanced searching technique
- Uses AND with OR statements

(felines OR cats) AND (canines OR dogs)

Using Quotes

- Use to keep phrases together as one term
- Best when searching for titles or proper names

“violence against women” AND “primary prevention”

or

“Through a Public Health Lens: Preventing Violence Against Women”



Evaluating Resources

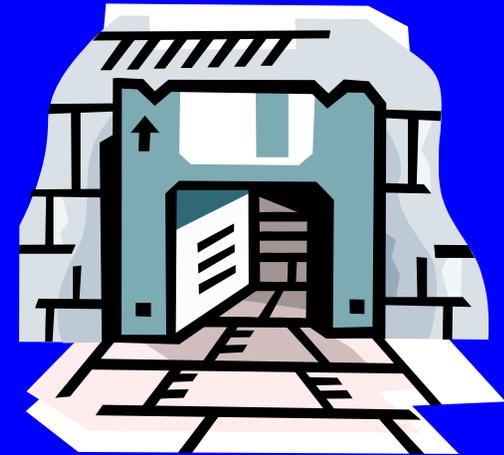
Consider:

- Publisher/Author
- Affiliation
- Purpose
- Date
- Personal knowledge



Data Searching Hints

- Find someone to help you evaluate the data and understand the limits
 - VAWnet
 - NSVRC
 - Public Health Department
 - Injury Control
 - University / College
 - Demographics (Dept of Finance)
 - Dept of Justice
- Find good gateways to data
 - www.VAWnet.org
 - www.NSVRC.org
- Use multiple sources of data



Web Site Navigation

Applications of Searching Strategy

Web Site Navigation Techniques

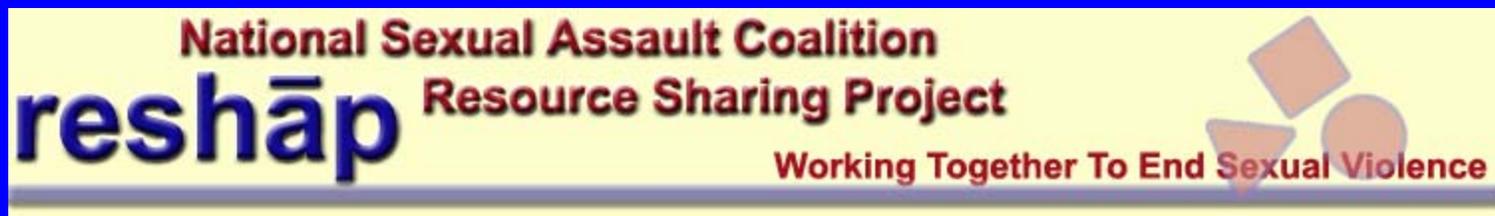
Browsing & searching options:

- Site Search
- Internal Navigation - Design & Structure
- Site Map
- Library Database

Site Search

- Searches site content only
- Use standard Boolean Techniques

Internal Navigation

- Intentionally designed for browsing
- Structured according to needs of primary audience

Site Map

- List of all areas and pages on the site
- Reveals site structure & organization

Library Database

- Search database of materials available in an organizational or university collection
- Simple & advanced search options provided
- Some have restricted access
