The Prevention Continuum

Primary



Approaches that take place

BEFORE

violence has occurred to prevent initial perpetration or victimization

Secondary



Immediate

responses

AFTER

violence has occurred to deal with the consequences in the short-term

Tertiary



Long-term

responses

AFTER

violence to deal with the lasting consequences and treatment interventions



Local Policy is Critical

4 of 10 reasons

- Local policies can be *tailored* to individual community needs.
- Local initiatives *raise community awareness* and support.
- Local communities are *not burdened with bureaucracy* that often inhibits progress at the state and national levels.
- Local initiatives are a *laboratory for broader policy change*, providing valuable clues to the most effective and appropriate models.




