SESSIONS AROUND VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN. PREVENTION, SO WE CAN BE ABLE TO SHARE THAT. THE WIKI IS LIKE WICKIPEDIA, EXCEPT IT IS DEDICATE THE ONLY TO VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN PREVENTION WHERE PEOPLE WHO ARE DOING THE WORK CAN CONTRIBUTE IDEAS AND SHARE HOW THEY CAN BE ABLE TO DO THAT WORK. ALSO, YOU CAN SIGN UP FOR YOUR PREVENT CONNECT EMAIL GROUP OR LISTSERV, WE RECENTLY JUST HAD MORE THAN A THOUSAND PEOPLE ON THIS.

IT IS A VIBRANT DISCUSSION OF PEOPLE WHO DO PREVENTION WORK THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY AND THE WORLD. WHERE WE HAVE MANY DISCUSSIONS, RECENTLY THERE WAS A RATHER LONG DISCUSSION LOOKING AT BURGER KING ADS AND RAISING CONCERNS ABOUT THAT AND BEING ABLE TO TALK ABOUT HOW ONE CAN TAKE ACTION TO BE ABLE TO CHALLENGE THE SEXISM WITHIN THOSE ADS.

WE ARE LOOKING AT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, ALL FORMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, ALL FORMS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT. WE ARE LOOKING AT VIOLENCE ACROSS THE LIFESPAN. WHAT WE WANT TO DO AT PREVENTION CONNECTION IS TO TALK ABOUT HOW TO PREVENT BEFORE VIOLENCE STARTS IN THE FIRST PLACE.

AND HOW TO BE ABLE TO CONNECT TO OTHER FORMS OF VIOLENCE.

OTHER OPPRESSIONS AND OTHER SOCIAL ISSUES THAT WE HAVE TO BE ABLE TO ADDRESS, DEVELOP EFFECTIVE AND POWERFUL PREVENTION WORK. I DO WANT TO HIGHLIGHT THAT WE ARE A PART OF A EFFORT FUNNED BY THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND SEVERAL OF THE COLLABORATIVE PARTNER, NATIONAL SEXUAL VIOLENCE RESOURCE ACCEPTER, NATIONAL YOUTH VIOLENCE RESOURCE CENTER, NATIONAL ON-LINE RESOURCE CENTER ENCOURAGE YOU TO VISIT THEM.

>> EXACTLY. WELCOME TO YET ANOTHER EXCITING FORUM IN THIS SERIES ON BUILDING THE MOVEMENT FOR VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN TO PREVENT VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN.

WE HAVE A REALLY EXCITING AGENDA TODAY FOR YOU. AND, LARRY AND I ARE REALLY HAPPY TO BE ABLE TO DO THIS TOGETHER.

IT HAS BEEN A WHILE SINCE BACK HERE AT THE SAME TIME.

WE ARE GOING TO START OFF BY JUST SHOWING YOU SOME SLIDE OF SOME MILESTONES IN THE MOVEMENT. NEW SPEAKER: I LIKE THIS SLIDE.

I KNOW IT IS PARTICULARLY WHEN YOU PUT IT UP IN A

PRESENTATION, ALMOST IMPOSSIBLE TO READ.

SO MUCH DETAIL.

SMALL WRITING.

BUT IT IS, IT IS REALLY IMPORTANT BECAUSE IT

SHOWS HOW MANY DIFFERENT ACTIVITIES AND OF COURSE

THESE ARE JUST SOME OF THE HIGHLIGHTS.

HOW MANY DIFFERENT ACTIVITIES, LIZ, HAS JUST

HAPPENED OVER THE LAST SAY, 3, 3.5 DECADES.

ALMOST FOUR DECADES NOW. AND IT REALLY, IT JUST

ILLUSTRATES REALLY THE POWER OF A MOVEMENT THAT WAS THINKING OF THE TERM MOVEMENT. OF COURSE, FOR THIS OPPORTUNITY TO TALK TOGETHER IN THE NOTION THAT A MOVEMENT MEANS THINGS MOVE. AND HOW DO WE MAKE THE MOVE AND A LOT OF THINGS HAVE MOVED RIGHT HERE ON THE SLIDE.

NEW SPEAKER: I MEAN, STARTING FROM THE 6 ESTABLISHMENT OF THE EARLIEST RAPE CRISIS CENTERS TO, REALLY, THE PASSAGE OF VAW AND SECOND PASSAGE OF VAW, WHAT WE WANT YOU TO DO IS TAKE A MOMENT TO TEXT CHAT IN.

LOOK AT MILE STEENS.

WE WANT TO ASK, WHAT DO YOU THINK THAT IT TOOK OF LEADERSHIP TO ACCOMPLISH THE MILESTONES? AT LEADERSHIP, WE ARE TALKING THE LOCAL, STATE, REGIONAL, NATIONAL LEVEL.

GREAT.

WE ARE SEEING THINGS LIKE COURAGE, VISION, PATIENCE. AND THIS IS WHAT WE ARE CALLING ON IN OUR LEADERSHIP. THIS IS WHAT OUR DISCUSSION IS GOING TO TALK ABOUT TODAY. NEW SPEAKER: AND I THINK WITH EACH ONE, DETERMINATION COME UP A COUPLE OF TIMES UNDERSTANDING COLLABORATION, COMING UP, PASSION AGAIN. PERSEVERANCE AND KIND OF LIKE THE PATIENCE, WE ARE SEEING HARD WORK, NOT AFRAID. NEW SPEAKER: WILLINGNESS TO SPEAK UP. NEW SPEAKER: THIS IS A GREAT, GREAT LIST. FOR EACH OF THESE, ACTUALLY, I WOULD LOVE TO PUT OUT THE QUESTION, WHO, YOU KNOW, WHOS DETERMINATION, WHOSE CREATIVITY? WHO DO WE LOOK FOR TO THAT? WHAT DOES IT MEAN THAT SOMEONE IS A LEADER? WHAT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY? HOW DO YOU

WORK WITH COLLEAGUES? WHO CONTRIBUTES DIFFERENT PIECES OF THIS? GOING AROUND THE LEADERS INSTEAD OF THROUGH.

THAT IS AN INTERESTING WAY TO PUT IT. JACKLYN. EDUCATION OF CHANGE MAKER, YEAH, THAT REALLY IS IMPORTANT. AND, IT IS INTERESTING THAT THE LEGISLATORS ARE SEEN AS THE CHANGE MAKERS. OR MAYBE THEY ARE THE CHANGE, AGENTS. NEW SPEAKER: AGENTS.

NEW SPEAKER: SOMEONE ELSE MAKES THE CHANGE FIRST OR SOMETHING LIKE THAT. YOU KNOW, THERE IS A QUOTE I LIKE, IT IS, BLANKING ON WHO IT IS FROM THE ENVIRONMENTAL MOVEMENT WHO SAYS, YOU KNOW, POLITICIANS ARE LIKE WEATHER VANES, THEY JUST FEEL THE WIND BLOW.

AND, IT IS UP TO US TO REALLY MAKE THE WIND BLOW. NEW SPEAKER: I LIKE THAT.

NEW SPEAKER: I THINK IT IS REALLY INTERESTING. PATTI. HI, PATTI.

IT IS ALSO BECAUSE OF VICTIMS AND I THINK THAT IS UNFORTUNATELY, WHEN DO WE HAVE TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF CRISIS? LEARNING FROM MISTAKES. PEOPLE IN MARGINALIZED GROUPS.

I HOPE YOU ARE FOLLOWING ALONG WITH US IN THE 7 TEXT CHAT.

THIS IS VERY, VERY GOOD. WE ARE MOVING ON, NOW, LIZ.

NEW SPEAKER: EXACTLY MANY ONE OF THE REASONS WE LIKE TO START WITH THIS SLIDE IS TO JUST SHOW YOU NOT ONLY THE VAST ARRAY OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS, THAT HAVE BEEN ACCOMPLISHED, THAT HAVE BEEN ACHIEVED OVER THE LAST 3.5 DECADES OR SO.

BUT ALSO THAT WE ARE STILL MOVING FORWARD. AND

WHAT WE REALLY WANT TO TALK ABOUT TODAY, IS HOW DO WE MOVE FORWARD WITH A PRIMARY PREVENTION PERSPECTIVE WITH ENDING VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN. HOW DO WE STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN FROM OCCURRING IN THE FIRST PLACE? SO WHEN YOU THINK ABOUT ALL OF THE ACHIEVEMENTS THAT HAVE TAKEN PLACE THROUGHOUT THE HISTORY OF THE MOVEMENT, YOU KNOW, WE HAVE GOTTEN A LOT GOING ON AT THE SECONDARY AND TERTIARY LEVELS. WE ARE REALLY WORKING ON THE IMMEDIATE NEEDS AND WE HAVE BEEN MAKING GREAT INROADS THERE. BUT WE REALLY WANT TO PULL BACK A LITTLE NOW. AND, LOOK AT WHAT IT IS GOING TO TAKE TO BE INCORPORATE MORE OF A PRIMARY PREVENTION PERSPECTIVE INTO THE MOVEMENT. NEW SPEAKER: AND I THINK ONE OF THE THINGS THAT KIND OF BEEN ACCOMPLISHED EVEN WITH WHAT YOU ARE CALLING SECONDARY OR TERTIARY PREVENTION BY KIND OF IDENTIFYING PROBLEMS EARLIER. BY HELPING PEOPLE UNDERSTAND THIS IS NOT OKAY, EVEN THROUGH SEVERE FORMS OF PUNISHMENT WHEN THERE HAS BEEN. EXTREME VIOLENCE. IT IS, IT PLAYS SOME PART OF THE ROLE IN PRIMARY PREVENTION. IT STARTS TO QUESTION THE PREVIOUS NORMS. IT STARTS TO OPEN UP NEW NORMS. I WAS ACTUALLY AT A WORLD MEETING LAST WEEK IN TURKEY, I WAS TALKING WITH A WOMAN FROM TURKEY THERE, WHO SAID, WELL, YOU KNOW, YOU HAVE IT EASIER IN THE UNITED STATES BECAUSE HERE, THINGS THAT YOU TAKE FOR GRANTED, ARE NOT OKAY IN THE UNITED STATES. WE STILL TAKE FOR GRANTED, ARE OKAY. AND IT IS OKAY FOR A MAN TO BEAT A WOMAN AND THAT WHEN HE DOES, IF IT IS HIS WIFE, PEOPLE

ARE SAYING, WELL, IT IS NONE OF OUR BUSINESS. EVEN THE WIFE AT TIMES IS SAYING, WELL, YOU KNOW, THIS IS A PERSONAL THING BETWEEN ME AND MY HUSBAND.

SO I THINK THAT WE HAVE MADE SOME PROGRESS ON THAT NORMS ISSUE.

OBVIOUSLY, NOT NEARLY ENOUGH PROGRESS. AND, LET ME FORMALIZE THIS A LITTLE BIT NOW. 8 LET'S TALK A LITTLE BIT ABOUT WHAT WE WANTED TO ACCOMPLISH TODAY IN TERMS OF THE LEARNING OBJECTIVE.

NEW SPEAKER: WHERE WE ARE GOING WITH THIS, THIS IS, AS DAVID SAID EARLIER, PART OF A SERIES IN EXPANDING THE MOVEMENT. AND, WE FOCUS ON OUR LAST SERIES, IN OUR LAST FORUM ON SOME OF THE COMMON ELEMENTS OF SUCCESSFUL SOCIAL MOVEMENTS. AND, THESE HAVE BEEN TAKEN FROM RESEARCH ON MOVEMENT THEORY AND ALSO I WANT TO GIVE A SHOUTOUT TO AMY LEARNER AND HER COLLEAGUE NICOLE ALLEN.

WE INCLUDED A COUPLE OF ABSTRACTS IN THE MATERIALS LISTED ON THE WEB SITE FOR TODAY'S READING. THAT ACTUALLY SPELL OUT HOW A LOT OF THE ELEMENTS PLAYED OUT AND ARE PLAYING OUT TODAY IN THE DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PREVENTION MOVEMENT. WE WIDDLED IT DOWN TO SIX ELEMENTS, FRAMING, ARTICULAR GOALS RESOURCE MOBILIZATION, POLITICAL TUNE, LEADERSHIP AND MEMBERSHIP. AND, TODAY, WE ARE GOING TO BE FOCUSSING ON THE ROLE OF LEADERSHIP IN ADVOCACY FOR VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN PREVENTION.

AS WELL AS WHERE WE NEED TO GO WITH LEADERSHIP. NEW SPEAKER: SO THE AGENDA THEN, IS, OVERVIEW, YOU KNOW, WE'LL BE GIVING AN OVERVIEW. WE'LL COME BACK AND QUICKLY REVIEW, WHAT DO WE MEAN BY PRIMARY PREVENTION? TALK ABOUT THE LEADERSHIP IMPLICATIONS AS WE EXPAND THE VIOLENCE OF WOMEN MOVEMENT AND THE QUESTION WE WERE JUST CHATTING ABOUT, WHAT DOES IT TAKE FROM LEADERSHIP AND WHO IS THE -- WHERE DO WE LOOK TO THAT LEADERSHIP, TOO? IS IT ONE PERSON? IS IT A GROUP? IS IT A WELL -- YOU KNOW, WELL-KNOWN PERSON WE NEED LEADERSHIP FROM? IS IT SOMEONE QUIETER OR IS IT A VICTIM? YOU KNOW, WHERE DO WE SEE THE LEADERSHIP COMING FROM AS WELL AS WHAT IS IT? AND, YOU KNOW, WE REALLY WANT TO TALK IT THROUGH.

WITH OUR GUESTS, AS WELL AS AMONGST OURSELVES. AND, HAVE AN INTERACTIVE DISCUSSION, OPEN UP, CERTAINLY FOR ANY QUESTIONS, ANY COMMENTS AND AT THE END AS ALWAYS, EVALUATE WHAT WORK AND DIDN'T WORK.

WE DO BETTER NEXT TIME.

NEW SPEAKER: EXACTLY.

EXACTLY.

OUR LEARNING OBJECTIVE FOR THE DAY ARE -- OR TWO, EXPLORE THE ROLE OF LEADERSHIP OR ADD VASE TO EXPAND THE MOVEMENT, OR DISCUSS SPECIFIC ACTIONS 9 THAT ARE NEEDED TO DEVELOP AND SUPPORT LEADERSHIP.

WE HAVE ON THE LINE WITH US, LEA HEGGE IN MONTANA WHO IS GOING TO COME ON LATER AS WE GO THROUGH THE INTRODUCTORY PART.

WHO IS GOING TO SHARE WITH US HER PERSPECTIVE WHO IS ALSO BRINGING UP LEADERSHIP IN A RURAL

COMMUNITY TO CONTINUE THE NEXT GENERATION OF VAW

PREVENTION LEADERS.

NEW SPEAKER: I'M GLAD, LEA, YOU ARE WITH US. AND THAT YOU ARE WITH US. AND I WAS WATCHING THE TEXT CHAT BEFORE AND SOMEONE FROM A REAL COMMUNITY SAYING, ONLY ONE AND MORE AND MORE PEOPLE ARE MENTIONING THAT THEY ARE COMING FROM RURAL COMMUNITIES.

I THINK THAT IN SOME WAYS OBVIOUSLY THE CHALLENGES ARE THE SAME ONLY IN SOME CASES MAY BE A LITTLE BIT MORE SO. SOMETIMES THE RESOURCES ARE A LITTLE BIT LESS.

SOMETIMES THERE IS A SPECIALNESS ABOUT CERTAIN RURAL COMMUNITIES THAT CAN REALLY BE AN EXTRA ADVANTAGE.

IT WILL BE FUN TO KIND OF GET INTO THAT LATER. BECAUSE THIS COMES UP IN EVERY FIELD THAT I WORK IN.

WHAT IS DIFFERENT ABOUT RURAL WHEN TALKING NUTRITION? WHEN TALKING ABOUT STREET VIOLENCE. WHEN WE ARE TALKING, WHEN I DID WORK PREVIOUSLY ON HE TOBACCO PREVENTION MUCH HOW DO WE DO THIS IN A RURAL SITE? I THINK THOSE OF US WHO WORK IN A URBAN PERSPECTIVE MORE CAN LEARN A LOT FROM PEOPLE WHO ARE KIND OF REALLY LEADERS AT THE RURAL LEVEL.

NEW SPEAKER: PRECISELY.

I AM GOING TO BACK UP A LITTLE BIT, I AM GOING TO LET LARRY DESCRIBE WHAT WE MEAN BY PRIMARY PREVENTION.

NEW SPEAKER: I ALWAYS LIKE TO SAY, WHAT -- WHEN THE WORD PREVENTION COMES UP, THE FIRST WORDS THAT I WAS ALWAYS GIVEN WERE, YOU KNOW, JUST TELL SOMEBODY SOMETHING, SO MAKE SURE THAT THEY HAVE THE INFORMATION AND SO MY FIRST TILE WAS WE NEED TO MOVE BEYOND BROCHURES. WE NEED TO MOVE BEYOND SIMPLY HEALTH FARES. SO I LIKE THE NOTION THAT PREVENTION IS A WELL THOUGHT OUT SYSTEMATIC PROCESS THAT PROMOTES HEALTHY ENVIRONMENTS AS WELL AS BEHAVIORS. SO THEREFORE, IN THIS CASE, REDUCE THE LIKELIHOOD OF FREQUENCY OF VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN.

WHEN WE SAY PRIMARY PREVENTION, IT IS REALLY, AS 10 YOU WERE SAYING, EARLIER, LIZ, IT IS THE TERM BEFORE. IT IS, WHAT DO WE DO BEFORE THE VIOLENCE OCCURS?

NOT HOW DO WE CATCH IT EARLY WITH SCREENING MUCH HOW DO WE KINE OF INTERVENE BEFORE WITH IT GETS REALLY TOO VIOLENT OR GOES ON TOO LONG. BUT WHAT DO WE DO IN THE FIRST PLACE? AGAIN, THAT NOTION, IT IS NOT ALWAYS WHAT DO WE DO WITH AN INDIVIDUAL AS A FAMILY, BUT WHAT DO WE DO TO CHANGE THE ENVIRONMENT? THAT IS WHAT WE ARE LEARNING ABOUT THE BEST PREVENTION IN ALMOST EVERY FIELD IS THAT IT TAKES CHANGING THE COMMUNITY ENVIRONMENT, THE SOCIAL ENVIRONMENT, THE POLITICAL ENVIRONMENT, AT THE SAME TIME THAT WE CHANGE WHAT WE DO IN OUR INDIVIDUAL AND FAMILY RELATIONSHIPS. THIS IS A QUICK SLIDE MOST OF YOU PROBABLY SEEN BEFORE. PLACES PRIMARY PREVENTION ON A CONTINUUM.

IT REALLY JUST DESCRIBES WHERE AN INTERVENTION TAKES PLACE. AND PRIMARY, WE ARE DEALING WITH THINGS UPFRONT, BEFORE VIOLENCE HAS OCCURRED AS OPPOSED TO DEALING WITH THE IMMEDIATE RESPONSES AFTER OR THE LONG TERM RESPONSES AFTER VIOLENCE. NEW SPEAKER: AND YOU KNOW, A FUN EXERCISE, IF YOU ARE WITH A GROUP, OR WORKING WITH A GROUP, IT IS FOR PEOPLE TO JUST MAKE A LIST KIND OF ON PIECES OF STICKY PAPER.

PUT THIS CONTINUUM UP ON A PIECE OF POSTER PAPER. AND JUST HAVE PEOPLE KIND OF LAY OUT HOW MUCH OF THE WORK IS GOING ON WHICH OF THESE THREE LEVELS, OR WHERE DOES IT ALL FIT.

IT GIVES YOU A GOOD PICTURE OF WHAT GOES ON IN THE COMMUNITY AND WHAT YOU CAN BUILD UPON. NEW SPEAKER: YES.

IT ALSO REINFORCES THE IDEA OF THIS BEING ON A CONTINUUM BECAUSE CERTAIN ITEMS WILL FALL VERY SQUARELY BETWEEN PRIMARY AND SECONDARY OR SECONDARY AND TERTIARY.

GREAT. ALL RIGHT. SO THIS SLIDE, WE TALKED ABOUT THIS A LITTLE BIT IN OUR LAST ONE. I JUST WANT TO KIND OF REMIND PEOPLE, AND FOR THOSE OF YOU WHO ARE NEW TO THIS ONE, WHEN WE TALK ABOUT LEADERSHIP, IN RELATIONSHIP TO SUCCESSFUL SOCIAL MOVEMENTS, THESE ARE SOME OF THE ELEMENTS OF LEADERSHIP THAT ROSE TO THE TOP. YOU CAN HAVE EITHER A VERY CHARISMATIC, SINGLE LEADER WHICH HAS THE ADVANTAGES IN TERMS OF BEING ABLE TO HAVE A VERY REAL PRESENCE TO THE MOVEMENT BUT ALSO HAVING A MULTIPLE OR DIFFUSED LEADERSHIP CAN PROVIDE CONTINUITY ACROSS DIVERSE LOCALS. 11 SO ALSO EASIER IN SOME WAYS WHEN DEALING WITH GRASSROOTS EFFORTS TO HAVE A MULTITUDE LEADERSHIP. KIND OF FORUM.

IN TERMS OF THE VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN PREVENTION MOVEMENT, A LOT OF PEOPLE WEIGHED IN LAST TIME AND REALLY TALKED ABOUT THE GRASSROOTS LEADERSHIP THAT HAS BEEN PIVOTAL IN MOVING THE SUCCESSES OF THE VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN PREVENTION MOVEMENT. WE ALSO WHEN WE ARE TALKING ABOUT SUCCESSFUL LEADERSHIP, WE ARE TALKING LEADERS THAT CAN ENSURE THAT THE MEMBERSHIP BODY IS REPRESENTED IN DECISIONS AND ACTIVITIES AND THAT THE MEMBERSHIP BODY KNOWS THAT THEY HAVE A VOICE THERE. AND, WE ALSO WERE TALKING ABOUT LEADERS WHO WERE ABLE TO MOBILIZE, ALERT AND INSPIRE MEMBERS ON A LONG TERM BASIS.

NEW SPEAKER: I'M JUST KIND OF CURIOUS, I WANT TO SUGGEST A QUICK HAND RAISE HERE.

WHEN YOU THINK ABOUT YOUR COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP, HOW MANY OF YOU WOULD SAY THAT FOR THE MOST PART IS ONE PERSON THAT COMES TO MIND. VERSUS

OBVIOUSLY THERE IS MULTIPLE PEOPLE.

SO RAISE YOUR HAND IF IT IS ONE PERSON THAT COMES TO MIND.

NEW SPEAKER: VERY SLOWLY.

NEW SPEAKER: WE'LL GIVE IT A MINUTE. WELL, IT IS

MOVING UP SLOWLY.

KEEP MOVING. OKAY.

IT SOUNDS LIKE 11 OR 12 PEOPLE.

WHY DON'T YOU LOWER YOUR HANDS.

GOING UP MORE.

MAYBE TAKE PEOPLE A WHILE TO FIND THE HAND RAISE.

SO WHY DON'T YOU LOWER YOUR HANDS.

HOW MANY PEOPLE WOULD SAY IT IS A MULTIPLE PEOPLE

COME TO MIND. THAT WAY WE'LL SEE HOW MANY PEOPLE REALLY.

YEAH, SHOOTING UP RIGHT AWAY.

NEW SPEAKER: YEP.

SO IT SOUNDS LIKE CONSENSUS IS THE WRONG WORD BUT

IT SOUNDS LIKE YOU COULD DROP YOUR HANDS NOW, BUT CLEARLY MORE THAN HALF OF YOU. AND COMPARED TO THE OTHER, IT IS, YOU KNOW, 5, 6 TIMES AS LIKELY. IT SOUNDS LIKE WE ARE RECOGNIZING THAT THERE IS KIND OF THIS MULTIPLICITY.

FROM DEBBIE TUCKER, ON DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE IN TEXAS.

SHE SAYS LEADERSHIP COMES FROM EVERY LEVEL IN THIS MOVEMENT.

PEOPLE POP UP ALL OVER THE PLACE IN THE LOCAL COMMUNITIES AND THEIR STATES. CREATING THE ENERGY AND EXCITEMENT TO BRING PEOPLE INTO A COMMITMENT TO THIS ALONG SIDE OF US. AND IN DEBBIE'S PERSPECTIVE, AND SHE'S SEEN LEADERSHIP DEVELOP, AND THAT IS WHY I AM EXCITED TO HAVE LEA ON THE LINE WITH US.

PERFECT.

NEW SPEAKER: I THINK IT WOULD BE HELPFUL, WE PROBABLY CAN'T GET INTO THE DETAIL HERE, LIZ. BUT IT WOULD BE HELPFUL TO SAY, OKAY, WHAT IS THAT WORK? IF THERE IS A COUPLE OF PEOPLE DOING THAT WORK, MAYBE WE SHOULD NOTE THAT. SO YOU CAN SEE HOW YOU FIT WITH OTHERS.

BUT WE USE THIS EVOLUTION TO EFFECTIVE PREVENTION

TO REALLY HELP COMMUNITIES, HELP COALITIONS, AND

TO HELP INDIVIDUALS KIND OF SAY, WHERE ARE WE?

AND WHERE DO WE WANT TO GO.

NEW SPEAKER: EXACTLY.

WHY DON'T YOU CLICK ANYWHERE FROM 1-5.

DAVID, PULL UP THE POLLING, PLEASE.

THIS IS, AS LARRY SAID, AN EVOLUTION. ON THE ONE

SIDE, YOU ARE LESS DEVELOPED IN THAT AREA.

AND THE FIVE THE, YOU ARE MORE DEVELOPED IN THAT AREA.

SOMEONE ASKED, SHOULD 2 AND 4 BE BLANK? 2 AND 4 ARE SOMEWHERE IN THE MIDDLE.

SO ONE IS, IT IS KIND OF ON ONE EXTREME,

DIFFICULTY.

OTHER, YOU FEEL EFFECTIVE.

IT IS KIND OF WHAT YOUR RANKING BETWEEN 1-5.

2-4 ARE NOT TO, YOU KNOW, 2 IS NOT TOO GOOD.

FOUR IS QUITE GOOD.

NOT ALL OF THE WAY. WHY DON'T WE CUE IT UP. NEW SPEAKER: MOST PEOPLE ARE COMING IN AT THE 3. THEY HAVE SOMEWHAT ARTICULATE A CLEAR MISSION OR EMOTION TO THE COLLABORATIVE. THIS IS IMPORTANT. EFFECTIVE LEADERSHIP, THAT LEADERS NOT ONLY HAVE A CLEAR VISION, BUT THAT THEY CAN ARTICULATE THAT VISION NOT ONLY TO MEMBERS OF THE COLLABORATIVE BUT TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC AS WELL. PROBABLY PERCENTAGES OF ALL OF THE PARTICIPANTS. NEW SPEAKER: YES.

NEW SPEAKER: BUT OF THE PEOPLE WHO VOTED, ASSUMING THAT THE PEOPLE WHO DIDN'T VOTE DIDN'T VOTE BECAUSE THEY FEEL LIKE THEY CAN'T ARTICULATE THE VOTE. SOMEWHERE IN THE MIDDLE. 18 WE HAVE STRENGTH THERE.

WITH ONLY, YOU KNOW, ONE OUT OF FIVE, TO 1 OUT OF 7 OF THE PEOPLE AT NUMBER 5, WE HAVE AN AREA THAT WE NEED TO BUILD ON.

WHY DON'T WE MOVE TO THE NEXT QUESTION OF EVOLUTION TO EFFECTIVE PREVENTION. AND THAT HAS TO DO WITH YOUR, KIND OF, HOW, TO WHAT EXTENT, YOU KNOW, KIND OF THE BALANCE YOU SEE BETWEEN PAYING ATTENTION TO WHAT THE MONEY TELLS YOU TO DO, BOTH VERSUS WHAT THE BROAD COMMUNITY FOCUS TELLS YOU TO DO.

AND OBVIOUSLY, THEY ARE BOTH VERY IMPORTANT BUT I GUESS OUR EVOLUTION AS WE WANT TO END UP WITH THE FOCUS MISSION, BUT WE WANT TO BE REALISTIC, TOO. THE MONEY COUNTS.

SO WHERE WOULD YOU PLACE YOURSELF ON THE SCALE? NEW SPEAKER: YOU, YOUR ORGANIZATION --

NEW SPEAKER: YEAH, IN AWAY THAT THE EVOLUTION TO FIVE IS NOT ONLY DEPENDENT ON YOU BUT GETTING A FEEL TO START TO RESPECT THE NOTION OF THE MISSION THAT WE HAVE.

NEW SPEAKER: KAREN POWERS TYPED IN, THEY ASKED FOR FUNDING BASED ON THE MISSION WHICH IS REALLY, YOU KNOW, RIGHT AT THE FIVE. BEING ABLE TO ALIGN FUNDING, OPPORTUNITIES, WITH ONE'S MISSION. NEW SPEAKER: RIGHT IN THE MIDDLE.

AGAIN, WHAT DO WE HAVE? 35-49, WE HAVE A LITTLE BIT MORE.

WE HAVE 75% OF THE PEOPLE RESPONDING THIS TIME.

NEW SPEAKER: YEAH, SO, FOR A MINUTE, ABOUT YOUR MEMBERSHIP ABOUT CAPACITY AND GET A QUESTION UP IN A SECOND.

NEW SPEAKER: GREAT.

NEW SPEAKER: YOU KNOW, HOW DOES IT WORK? HOW ARE YOU DOING?

NEW SPEAKER: AS A FIELD, I THINK THAT SOME OF THE

STRATEGIES, FOR EXAMPLE, SOME OF THE LISTS EARLIER WITH YOUTH, WE NEED TO START TO FIGURE OUT HOW TO TRANSLATE IT.

WE NEED TO TALK ABOUT WHAT EXPECTATIONS ARE REALISTIC.

YOU KNOW, I THINK THAT AT A TIME OF DOWN ECONOMY, WHEN THERE IS MORE PRESSURE, SOME OF THE THINGS THAT PEOPLE MIGHT CHOOSE TO DO AT OTHER TIMES ARE HARDER FOR PEOPLE TO STEP UP AND DO. SO THAT IS CERTAINLY PART OF IT.

WE ARE WORKING WITHIN AN ENVIRONMENT. I THINK THAT THIS IS A SIGN THAT WE HAVE MORE WORK TO DO IN THE FIELD.

NEW SPEAKER: VERY MUCH SO. 20 THANK YOU, DAVID. DAVID IS GOING TO RETURN IT. BACK TO ME. GREAT. WE ARE GOING TO GO AHEAD AND TALK ABOUT SOME OF THE STUFF THAT CAME OUT OF OUR LAST DISCUSSION ON LEADERSHIP. ALSO, WE PUT TOGETHER PREVENTION INSTITUTE IN CONCERT WITH THE ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON FOUNDATION. PUT TOGETHER A CONVENING PREVENTION INSTITUTE A FEW YEARS AGO THAT BROUGHT TOGETHER A CADRE OF NATIONAL LEADERS. FROM A PRIMARY PERSPECTIVE. IN TERMS OF GUIDING PRINCIPLES FOR THE PRIMARY PREVENTION OF VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN, ONE OF THE THINGS THAT EMERGED FROM THE CONVENING WAS THE NEED TO ENGAGE COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP AND BE RESPONSIVE TO COMMUNITY STRENGTHS AND NEEDS. NEW SPEAKER: THAT IS DIRECTIVE. BECAUSE CAME FROM JOHNSON ORGANIZATION. INFLUENTIAL WITH STATE FUNDERS.

NEW SPEAKER: VERY MUCH SO.

WE ARE GOING TO, WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU RIGHT NOW IN TERMS OF PARTNERSHIPS. WHAT TYPES OF AGENCIES AND AGENTS ARE NOT PARTNERSHIPS WITH. IN FOSTERING THE NEXT WAVE OF VIOLENCE WITH PREVENTION MOVEMENT AND LEADERS. AWE, GREAT. THIS IS GREAT. PEOPLE ARE ABLE TO ACTUALLY ARTICULATE WHO IN YOUR COMMUNITY MIGHT BE A USEFUL PARTNER.

IN OUR NEXT FORUM, WE ARE GOING TO FOCUS ON DIVERSE PARTNERSHIPS. AND SO, KEEP THESE IN MIND. AS YOU ARE GOING THROUGH THIS LIST, FAITH-BASED ORGANIZATIONS, SOME SCHOOLS, MEDIA, SPORTS, BUSINESSES, DO YOU KNOW WHO YOU SHOULD BE 21 INVITING TO THE TABLE? AND WE JUST NEED TO FIGURE OUT STRATEGIES AS LARRY SAID EARLIER, MAKE THE AGENDA, EVERYONE'S AGENDA.

NEW SPEAKER: AND ON THE OTHER HAND, SAYING FAITH-BASED AND TRYING TO PARTNER WITH GROUPS LIKE THIS. HOPEFULLY WE CAN PULL IN EVERY SIDE. I THINK THIS IS REALLY HELPFUL BECAUSE I THINK THAT SOMETIMES WE TALK TO THE PEOPLE WE ARE MOST COMFORTABLE TALKING WITH.

I THINK OUT OF THIS CONVERSATION, PEOPLE EMERGE WITH THE SENSE OF STRATEGY AND SAY, WAIT A MINUTE. AT LEAST IN MANY OF OUR COMMUNITIES, LEADERSHIP MEANS REACHING OUT HERE ON THE TEXT CHAT WHICH OF COURSE IS AVAILABLE AFTER THE SESSION. IS IT REALLY, REALLY GOOD LIST OF WHO TO REACH OUT TO.

NEW SPEAKER: EXACTLY.

NEW SPEAKER: AND THEN PEOPLE CAN SIT DOWN IN A GROUP AND SAY, LET'S DIVIDE IT UP.

WHO ARE TEN PEOPLE, OR TEN GROUPS, WE WANT TO REACH OUT TO OVER THE NEXT COUPLE OF MONTHS. HOW ARE WE GOING TO DO THAT? WHAT ARE THE STEPS TO DO THAT? WHO KNOWS THESE PEOPLE? HOW DO WE BUILD UP THE TIES, ETC., ETC.

YOU KNOW, IT IS NOT GOING TO ALL OF A SUDDEN GO FROM A STRUGGLING TO A FLOURISHING COALITION. BUT IT CAN REALLY, REALLY ADD VALUE TO THE WORK THAT IS BEING DONE.

AND ADD IMPACT TO THE WORK THAT IS BEING DONE. NEW SPEAKER: AND ALONG THOSE LINE, TWO OF THE OTHER THINGS THAT CAME OUT OF THE CONVENING THAT WE HELD, WAS THE IMPORTANCE OF INCLUDING NECESSARY COMMUNITY PARTNERS AND LEADERS AND PROMOTING GREATER COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP. SO JUST BY THE LIST THAT IS JUST ROLLING THROUGH RIGHT NOW, WE CAN SEE THAT WE KNOW WHO THE COMMUNITY, WHO THE COMMUNITY LEADERS ARE. IT IS JUST A MATTER OF FIGURING OUT TO PARTNER WITH THEM. GREAT. NEW SPEAKER: SURE. WELL, FIRST OF ALL, I HAVE

BEEN IN THIS POSITION A LITTLE OVER TWO YEARS.

AND, SORT OF MY, THE WAY I GOT IN THE DOOR,

SEXUAL VIOLENCE SERVICES IS THROUGH VOLUNTEERING AND FROM A YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PERSPECTIVE, WE WORKED AT BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB IN MINNEAPOLIS AND ST. PAUL BEFORE I MOVED OUT TO MONTANA.

ABOUT 4-5 YEARS AGO.

AND I STARTED OUT HERE AT A BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB, AND DECIDED THAT WE SHOULD FORM A COLLABORATION WITH THEIR YOUTH LEADERSHIP. THAT DSVS WAS DOING.

I WANTED TO DO PREVENTION PROGRAMS AT BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB, SO WE FORMED A COLLABORATION AND I JOINED THE COORDINATED, COMMUNITY RESPONSE TEAM AND WE STARTED DOING TEEN DATING VIOLENCE PREVENTION SUMMITS ANNUALLY IN 2004. AND HAVE DONE ONE EVERY YEAR SINCE.

THIS YEAR WE HAVE JUST RECEIVED FUNDING TO GO INTO TWO OTHER COUNTIES. IN YELLOWSTONE COUNTIES, ONE WHERE BILLINGS IS LOCATED. MONTANA'S VERSION OF URBAN.

A LITTLE SMALLER THAN SOME OTHER PLACES. I THINK IT WILL BE INTERESTING TO HAVE THIS CONVERSATION, I'M LOOKING AT A LOT OF THE TEXT CONVERSATIONS. WE HAVE RURAL AND URBAN REPRESENTED.

I THINK, I THINK WE CAN LEARN LESSONS FROM EACH OTHER.

QUITE A BIT. AND JUST, FOR THOSE OF YOU WHO DON'T KNOW WHAT DELTA IS, IT IS A CAPACITY BUILDING GRANT. FOR PRIMARY PREVENTION. CDC. FIVE YEAR GRANT IN 2003. WE JUST RECEIVED FUNDING FOR THREE MORE YEARS TO FOCUS ON PRIMARY PREVENTION AND HAVE A COORDINATED COMMUNITY **RESPONSE BASED ON PRIMARY PREVENTION.** NEW SPEAKER: YOU HAVE A DELTA FAN OUT THERE. SHEILA JOHNSON. **NEW SPEAKER: ALL RIGHT!** NEW SPEAKER: ALLEGEDLY. AFTER MAKING THE JOB SWITCH, WHAT MADE YOU INTERESTED OR COMPELLED OR TO WORK WITH DELTA? NEW SPEAKER: WELL, I WAS, WOMEN'S STUDIES IN 23 COLLEGE.

I WAS A SEXUAL ASSAULTED A VOE CAT IN COLLEGE. I DID HAVE A PASSION FOR VIOLENCE PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION PROGRAMS. AND THEN, WHEN I WORKED WITH YOUTH IN THE TWIN CITY, I COULD SEE A LOT OF FAMILY VIOLENCE AND GANG VIOLENCE AND THINGS LIKE THAT THERE.

I STARTED DOING SOME PREVENTION SERVICES THERE. I HAVE HAD A PASSION FOR IT.

I KNEW THAT WHEN I MOVED HERE, WITH THE RURAL SETTING, IT WOULD BE A DIFFERENT EXPERIENCE FOR ME AND IT MOTIVATED ME TO STEP UP AND I FEEL VERY FORTUNATE THAT THE POSITION OPENED WHEN IT DID. LEA, LET ME ASK YOU, WHAT ARE SOME OF THE PRIMARY PREVENTION ACTIVITIES YOU ARE INVOLVED WITH? NEW SPEAKER: SURE.

WE CAN GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE.

AND, THE CURRICULAR INSTRUCTION THAT WE DO IS EVERYTHING FROM HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS WHO DO FOCUS ON TEENS. WE DO RESPECT, BULLYING PREVENTION, MEDIA LITERACY, PRETTY MUCH THE WHOLE GAMMET. WE ARE REALLY FORTUNATE TO OFFER UP TO \$600 TO EACH HIGH SCHOOL TO RUN THEIR OWN VIOLENCE

PREVENTION CLUB.

NEW SPEAKER: THAT IS -- I WOULD SAY, MICRO AMOUNT OF MONEY, SOUNDS LIKE IT CAN HAVE AN IMPACT. NEW SPEAKER: IT DOES.

REALLY DOES.

THIS IS PART OF OUR YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM THAT I'LL TALK MORE ABOUT.

SO THOSE YOUTH CLUBS CAN DO, YOU KNOW, THEY CAN DO AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS BUT A LOT OF TIMES NOW, IN THE THIRD YEAR OF DOING THESE CLUBS, THIS HE ARE DOING MORE DEVELOPING THEIR OWN PRESENTATIONS FROM MIDDLE SCHOOL AND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS. AND THEN, WE DO, LIKE I SAID, OUR TEEN DATING VIOLENCE PREVENTION SUMMIT ANNUALLY. WHICH IS TEEN LEAD.

WE HAVE A TEEN LEADERSHIP STEERING COMMITTEE THAT ORGANIZES THE SUMMITS. WE ALSO DO VIOLENCE PREVENTION TRAININGS FOR ADULTS THAT SERVE YOUTH, EVERYTHING FROM TEACHERS TO COACHES TO YOUTH

EVERYTHING FROM TEACHERS TO COACHES TO YOUTH 24 WORKERS.

WE HAVE FORMED CARBON COUNTY MEN AGAINST VIOLENCE.

WE'LL DEVELOP MEN'S LEADERSHIP THAT WE WILL TALK ABOUT.

ONE PARTICULARLY GRIT GUY WHO IS NOW DOING

PRESENTATIONS IN THE SCHOOLS WITH ME.

HE IS A TEACHER AT RED LODGE HIGH SCHOOL.

AND THEN, I, WE ALSO HAVE THE CCR THAT IS FOCUSED

ON PRIMARY PREVENTION.

NEW SPEAKER: WHAT IS CCR?

NEW SPEAKER: COORDINATED COMMUNITY RESPONSE TEAM.

SO THAT CONSISTS OF, FOR US, CONSISTS OF TEENS,

TEACHER, COUNSELORS, ADMINISTRATORS, SCHOOL

ADMINISTRATORS, YOUTH WORKERS AND THEN WE HAVE

LAW ENFORCEMENT, JUDGES, LET'S SEE.

NEW SPEAKER: ANY HEALTH PEOPLE INVOLVED?

NEW SPEAKER: WE DO.

WE HAVE MEDICAL.

A FEW NURSES AND DOCTORS. I WOULD SAY, OUR --WHEN WE ARE FOCUSSING ON PRIMARY PREVENTION, THE SCHOOL ORIENTED PEOPLE ARE MORE ACTIVE. NEW SPEAKER: YES.

NEW SPEAKER: BUT WE DO BRING IN QUITE A FEW COMMUNITY MEMBERS.

>> YEAH, ONE OF THE THINGS WE HAVE BEEN LEARNING AS WE ARE LOOKING AT VIOLENCE PREVENTION AROUND THE COUNTRY, IS THAT IT SEEMS LIKE THE PUBLIC HEALTH SIDE, WHICH IS WHERE THE PREVENTION SIDE, DOESN'T GET AS INVOLVED IN VIOLENCE PREVENTION. WE NEED TO BRING THEM IN SOME WAYS BECAUSE THEY REALLY UNDERSTAND PREVENTION FROM OTHER FIELDS. THEY HAVE BEEN SKITTISH, FRANKLY ABOUT VIOLENCE PREVENTION AND THEN THEY DON'T GET ANY RESOURCES SO IT IS NOT IN AN AREA THAT THEY HAVE KIND OF SEEN ANY KIND OF PULL FROM. I THINK IT IS AN INTERESTING GROUP.

YOU MIGHT WANT TO THINK ABOUT.

BEFORE YOU GO ANY FURTHER, I WANT TO TRANSLATE A COUPLE OF THE QUESTIONS THAT CAME IN. ONE WAS ABOUT WHETHER -- I NOTICED YOU MENTIONED THE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS AND THAT WAS INTERESTING. ONE OF THE QUESTIONS WAS ABOUT PUSHBACK FROM THE SCHOOLS. AND THE OTHER QUESTION WAS, WHEN IS THE MONEY, WHERE DOES IT COME FROM? THE \$600. SAY A LITTLE ABOUT THOSE TWO THINGS. NEW SPEAKER: SURE.

I CAN TALK ABOUT THE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS FIRST. WE HAVE HAD PUSHBACK A LITTLE BIT. THIS IS OUR 25 FIFTH YEAR IN CARBON COUNTY SCHOOLS. WE HAVE NOW STARTED TO BE PRETTY SUCCESSFUL. WE ARE A RURAL AREA IN OUTSIDE OF RED LODGE'S, I WOULD SAY, WELL, WE ARE CONSIDERED FRONTIER AND WE HAVE A WILD WEST PATRIARCHAL ROLE GENDER ROLES AND A LOT OF THE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS ARE MALE. KIND OF FROM THE OLD SCHOOL ARK LITTLE BIT. AND IT WAS DIFFICULT, I KNOW. BEFORE I WAS HERE TO GET IN. PART OF WHAT WE HAVE DONE IS, WE HAVE REALLY WORKED HARD TO BE INVITED TO THE TEACHER TRAINING DAYS THAT HAPPENED IN THE FALL BEFORE SCHOOL STARTS. THAT WE CAN PRESENT WHAT PRIMARY PREVENTION IS. WE ALSO, I THINK THAT IT IS EASIER IN RURAL SCHOOLS TO KNOW MORE PEOPLE AT THE SCHOOL THAN IT WOULD BE IN URBAN AREA. WE HAVE NEIGHBORS THAT ARE TEACHERS AND THINGS LIKE THAT.

SO WE CAN TALK TO PEOPLE THAT WE KNOW AND GET, POINT PEOPLE AT EACH SCHOOL THAT ARE NOT SPECIFICALLY ADMINISTRATORS SO THAT THEY CAN TALK TO ADMINISTRATORS FOR US SO THAT WORKED AT SOME SCHOOLS.

IT HAS BEEN DIFFICULT BUT, PRIMARY PREVENTION DOES SELL.

IF YOU CAN GET THEIR EARS AND EYES ON YOU, SO THAT THEY ARE LISTENING TO WHAT PRIMARY PREVENTION IS, IT IS EASIER TO TALK ABOUT HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS AND HEALTHY COMMUNICATION AND MEDIA LITERACY, WITH STUDENTS AND SCHOOLS DO LIKE THAT CONCEPT INSTEAD OF TALKING ABOUT SPECIFIC DATING VIOLENCE 101 OR SEXUAL ASSAULT. OBVIOUSLY, WE DO HAVE REQUESTS FOR THAT AND WE WILL DO THOSE KIND OF THINGS.

BUT THE POSITIVE ASPECT DOES SO.

NEW SPEAKER: YOU SEE YOURSELF AS A LEADER IN THIS WORK?

NEW SPEAKER: I DO.

NEW SPEAKER: YOU THINK YOU ARE PERCEIVED AS A

LEADER BY THAT PATRIARCHY IN THAT WAY?

NEW SPEAKER: SLOWLY BUT SURELY I DO.

I'M YOUNG AND A WOMAN.

IT DEFINITELY HELPS HAVING A PARTNER IN A MAN.

BUT THAT IS DOING THIS WORK AS WELL. HE HAS, HE HAS GOTTEN US IN SOME DOORS THAT WE HAVEN'T

GOTTEN IN BEFORE.

I THINK THAT IS ONLY A GOOD THING.

I MEAN, IT HURT AS LITTLE BUT I CAN SAY, YOU

KNOW, I CAN PRESENT TO A SPECIFIC ORGANIZATION,

AND HE CAN PRESENT THE SAME THING AND HAS A 26 DIFFERENT IMPACT.

IT MAKES IT MORE OF A HUMAN RIGHTS ISSUE THAN A WOMAN'S ISSUE.

NEW SPEAKER: LEA, IN YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT IS THE ROLE OF LEADERSHIP IN THE VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN PREVENTION MOVEMENT? WHEN WE ARE TALKING ABOUT INJECTING A STRONGER PRIMARY PREVENTION FOCUS INTO THE MOVEMENT?

NEW SPEAKER: WELL, I THINK THE ROLE OF THE LEADERSHIP IS, YOU KNOW, IT IS ONLY WAY TO HELP THE MOVEMENT GROW.

INSPIRING PASSION GROWING IN PEOPLE WELL

RESPECTED AND GROWING IN COMMUNITIES THAT ARE

INSPECTED IN COMMUNITY, SPREADING THE WORD.

EDUCATING THOSE LEADERS TO BE, YOU KNOW, STARTING

THE CONVERSATIONS ABOUT PRIMARY PREVENTION IS

REALLY IMPORTANT AND, YOU KNOW, LEADERS IN THE MOVEMENT, EVERYTHING FROM SMALL COMMUNITIES TO THE NATIONAL LEVEL ARE INTEGRAL COMPONENTS TO MAKING SOCIAL CHANGE AND INSTILLING LEADERSHIP IN YOUTH IS ONLY GOING TO MAKE THAT FUTURE BRIGHTER IN THAT MOVEMENT. IN SMALL COMMUNITY, PEOPLE COMING FORTH WITH PASSION AND, YOU KNOW, THEY ARE ABLE TO BECOME STRONGER LEADERS IF THEY ARE MOTIVATED AND THEY ARE DOERS, "DOERS." THAT CAN CONNECT WITH PEOPLE IN THE COMMUNITY. INSPIRE OTHER PEOPLE.

I THINK THAT WE WILL GET MORE TO MEN'S LEADERSHIP.

I THINK THEIR ROLE IS VERY KEY AND HAS BEEN LACKING IN THIS MOVEMENT HISTORICALLY. SO, YOU KNOW, I THINK IN ENSURING THAT MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY ARE REPRESENTED IN THE LEADERSHIP. NEW SPEAKER: SO I'M JUST NOTING HERE, A COUPLE OF THE WORDS YOU JUST USED IN LEADERSHIP. PASSION. MOTIVATE. INSPIRE. DOERS. AND I'M WONDERING, HOW YOU THINK. SINCE YOU ACKNOWLEDGE THAT YOU ARE A LEADER AND, YOU KNOW, GROWING IN YOUR LEADERSHIP AND, WELL, ALSO GROWING IN THE WAYS THAT YOU RECOGNIZE AS A LEADER. HOW YOU THINK THOSE CHARACTERISTICS WERE DEVELOPED, TO WHAT EXTENT THEY WERE DEVELOPED IN THE FIELD. TO WHAT EXTENT JUST ABOUT THIS UNIT AS AN INDIVIDUAL. AND WHAT YOU MIGHT BE DOING INTENTIONALLY TO DEVELOP THOSE IN OTHERS. YOU KNOW, WHAT ARE THE STEPS SO THAT WE HAVE A **BROADER LEADERSHIP CADRE?** NEW SPEAKER: SURE. I CAN SPEAK PERSONALLY BEING

TRAINED AS A SEXUAL ASSAULT AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE 27 ADVOCATE, DEFINITELY HELPS ME TO BECOME MORE PASSIONATE IN THIS MOVEMENT. KNOWING WHAT SURVIVORS AND VICTIMS GO THROUGH. AND BEING EDUCATED ON THE STATISTICS, EVEN, FOR SOME COMMUNITY MEMBERS, CAN MOTIVATE THEM TO DO SOMETHING ABOUT IT.

I THINK THAT MAKING IT HIT HOME MORE WITH PEOPLE, MOVE THEM FORWARD, IF YOU CAN CONNECT IT. YOU KNOW, THIS, THIS IS NOT JUST A BUBBLE THAT HAPPENS OUT HERE.

IT IS AFFECTING EVERYBODY'S LIVES.

WE TALK A LOT ABOUT THE MEDICAL COSTS AND THINGS LIKE THAT.

OF DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE.

NEW SPEAKER: WHAT YOU ARE SAYING, SHARING THAT INFORMATION NOT ONLY INFORMATIVE BUT ACTUALLY MAY GET OTHER PEOPLE TO BE MORE ON A LEADERSHIP LEVEL?

NEW SPEAKER: I BELIEVE SO.

NEW SPEAKER: UH-HUH.

NEW SPEAKER: I THINK THAT IS MOTIVATED PEOPLE HERE IN OUR COMMUNITY.

I ALSO THINK THAT GIVING PEOPLE SKILLS AND TRAINING, WE HAVE DONE QUITE A BIT OF TRAINING WITH ADULTS WHO SERVE YOUTH SO THAT THEY ARE AWARE OF WHAT PRIMARY PREVENTION STRATEGIES ARE AND THINGS LIKE THAT.

AND WITH OUR YOUTH AND OUR MEN'S LEADERS WE HAVE DONE PUBLIC SPEAKING SKILLS, ADVOCACY SKILLS, THOSE IN LEADERSHIP SKILLS AND TEAM BUILDING, SO THAT THEY FEEL COMFORTABLE IN FRONT OF A CROWD, TALKING ABOUT THESE ISSUES AND ALSO IN THEIR

COMMUNITY WHEN SOMEBODY BRINGS UP A SEXIST JOKE OR, TO ME, SOMEBODY WHO CAN STAND UP TO THAT IS ALSO A LEADER IN THIS MOVEMENT. PROBABLY NOT AS SIGNIFICANTLY. BUT TO HAVE THE CONVERSATIONS AND TO HAVE CONFIDENCE IN WHAT YOU KNOW ABOUT PREVENTING THE VIOLENCE AND STANDING UP TO IT. NEW SPEAKER: WOULD YOU SAY THAT THE LEADERSHIP ATTRIBUTES OR SKILLS THAT NEED TO BE DEVELOPED BY MEN OR WOMEN ARE DIFFERENT? OR THE SAME? NEW SPEAKER: GOOD QUESTION. I THINK THAT THEY ARE THE SAME. BUT I THINK THAT IT IS HARDER IN THIS MOVEMENT TO, TO MOTIVATE MEN TO FEEL LIKE A PART OF THE MOVEMENT. I THINK THAT TRADITIONALLY MEN SEE THIS AS A WOMAN'S ISSUE. SO, YOU KNOW, THEY DON'T FEEL LIKE, I GUESS, HERE IN CARBON COUNTY, WE FOUND IT EASY TO ENGAGE MEN. TO, YOU KNOW, HAVE THEM SIGN A FATHER'S DAY 28 POSITION OR THINGS LIKE THAT. BUT MUCH HARDER TO GET THEM TO STEP UP TO THE NEXT LEVEL AND BE A LEADER AND ACTUALLY ORGANIZING EVENTS. BASED AROUND PRIMARY PREVENTION. SO I THINK THAT THE MOTIVATING FACTORS ARE A LITTLE BIT DIFFERENT. I THINK, ONCE THEY ARE THERE AND THE SKILLS AND THE TRAINING IS VERY SIMILAR. NEW SPEAKER: WHAT WOULD YOU THINK ABOUT THAT, LIZ? NEW SPEAKER: THE DIFFERENCES?

NEW SPEAKER: YEAH.

NEW SPEAKER: WELL, ACTUALLY, IN TALKING TO LEA EARLIER, YOU KNOW, SHE HAD A VERY INTERESTING PERSPECTIVE, THE DIFFERENCES OF MEN AND WOMEN. AND I THINK IN TERMS OF THE TRAINING, YOU KNOW, WE ARE SAYING THE SAME MESSAGE. BUT DIFFERENT THINGS ARE GOING TO INSPIRE US. AND BEFORE I ANSWER THAT QUESTION, LARRY, I WANT TO THROW THIS BACK TO LEA FOR A MINUTE. LEA, YOU MENTIONED THE ROLE OF MEN IN LEADERSHIP AND ROLE OF MEN IN THE MOVEMENT, HAS BEEN WIDELY DISCUSSED.

IN YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT IS THE ROLE OF MEN IN LEADERSHIP IN THE MOVEMENT?

NEW SPEAKER: WELL, I THINK, YOU KNOW, LIKE I JUST SAID, EFFECTIVELY ENGAGING MEN IN THE MOVEMENT, IS DIFFERENT THAN MEN IN LEADERSHIP.

I THINK MEN'S LEADERSHIP IS THE NEXT LEVEL THAT WE NEED TO OBTAIN NATIONALLY.

I THINK, I THINK SOME AREAS ARE REALLY GETTING THERE.

IT IS REALLY FUN TO WATCH. I THINK IN RURAL AREA, I THINK WE ARE A COUPLE YEARS BEHIND. AND I THINK, YOU KNOW, LIKE I SAID, ABOUT MY MALE COUNTERPART WHO CAN HAVE THE SAME, HE CAN PRETTY MUCH GIVE THE SAME SPEECH TO CIVIC ORGANIZE OR SCHOOL, THE EFFECT IS DIFFERENTLY BECAUSE OF THE HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE ON THIS BEING A WOMAN'S ISSUE, WE NEED TO REFRAIN THE DIALOGUE AND MAKE IT INTO, YOU KNOW, TALKING ABOUT MEN'S VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN OR AT LEAST, IF YOU, WE HAVE TO MEET COMMUNITIES WHERE THEY ARE AT AND SOME OF THE LOCAL COMMUNITY, I THINK, NEED TO HEAR THAT THIS IS A HUMAN'S RIGHT ISSUE AND IT AFFECTS EVERYONE.

AND IT IS NOT ENOUGH FOR A MAN TO SAY, HE IS NOT

GOING TO BEAT HIS WIFE.

BUT NEEDS TO DO SOMETHING TO PREVENT THE29VIOLENCE, YOU KNOW ON A BROADER SPECTRUM.AND, GETTING THEM TO STEP UP, AND TAKE ON THESEROLES, YOU KNOW, IN YOUR COMMUNITY, TO SPEAKPUBLICLY, AND TO ORGANIZE EVENTS IS CHALLENGING.AND I THINK THAT IS WHERE THE EDUCATION ASPECTCOMES IN. IF PEOPLE KNOW WHAT THE ISSUES ARE ANDTHEY KNOW THAT THEIR TAX DOLLARS ARE GOING TOTHESE THINGS AND THAT ARE USER EFFECTIVE ANDWITNESSING AT HOME AND, YOU KNOW, WE CAN'T ASSUMETHAT OUR YOUTH ARE WITNESSING HEALTHYRELATIONSHIPS AT HOME ON A REGULAR BASIS,NECESSARY.

SO, MEN CAN STEP UP AND BE MENTORS IN THAT WAY. I THINK, WHEN YOU FRAME THAT ISSUE, YOU KNOW, AS A YOUTH ISSUE TO MEN, THEY CAN STEP UP. I THINK THAT THEIR LEADERSHIP IS WHAT, I GUESS,

THAT MISSING LINK.

THAT WE ARE ALL TRYING TO INSTILL AND I THINK THAT FOR YOUTH, WHEN WE GO TO TALK TO BOYS AND GIRLS, HAVING BOTH GENDERS REPRESENTED IN PRESENTERS IS VERY, VERY IMPORTANT.

NEW SPEAKER: THANK YOU.

AND I MEAN, BACK TO LARRY'S QUESTION, I REALLY THINK THAT SOME OF THE QUESTIONS AND ISSUE WEST ARE DEALING WITH FROM A MALE OR FEMALE PERSPECTIVE WILL BE DIFFERENT.

AND THE ENVIRONMENT THAT OUR YOUNG MEN ARE GROWING UP IN, EVEN, JUST YOU THINK P THE BOY'S LOCKER ROOM AND WHAT GOES ON THERE. WHAT GOES ON, YOU KNOW, ON THE SPORTS BUS. ON THE WAY TO AN EVENT. THERE ARE DIFFERENT OPPORTUNITIES TO INTERSECT WITH YOUNG MEN IN AWAY THAT ARE GOING TO BE DIFFERENT FROM THE WAY THAT YOU WOULD INTERSECT WITH YOUNG WOMEN. AS LEA IS SAYING, YOU KNOW, THE INFORMATION THAT IS GOING TO BE MOTIVATIONAL OR INSPIRING, OR GOING TO INSTILL THAT PASSION IN PEOPLE, IT IS PROBABLY GOING TO BE THE SAME INFORMATION BUT THEY ARE GOING TO HEAR IT DIFFERENTLY AND THEY ARE GOING TO HEAR IT DIFFERENTLY FROM DIFFERENT. FROM MEN VERSUS WOMEN AS WELL. I WANT TO GET BACK TO THE RURAL ISSUE A LITTLE BIT. LEA. BEING A PART OF A RURAL COMMUNITY, WHAT ARE SOME OF THE PARTICULAR CHALLENGES OF LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT IN A RURAL AREA? WHAT ARE SOME OF THE UNIQUE OPPORTUNITIES THAT BEING IN A RURAL AREA PRESENTS? NEW SPEAKER: OKAY. WELL, LIKE I SAID BEFORE, SOME OF THE ATTITUDES HERE ARE, ARE TRADITIONAL. AND. YOU KNOW. SO THAT HAS BEEN AN ISSUE. 30 WE ALSO ARE VERY ISOLATED, I WOULD SAY. WE ARE, YOU KNOW, 60 MILES FROM THE NEAREST CITY. OUR COMMUNITIES ARE VERY SPREAD OUT. WE SPEND A LOT OF TIME IN THE CAR, DRIVING TO SCHOOLS AND TO OUR DIFFERENT COMMUNITIES AND SO THOSE COMMUNITIES HAVE HISTORICALLY BEEN FAIRLY ISOLATED FROM ANY KIND OF PREVENTION PROGRAMS. LET ALONE WHAT WE ARE TRYING TO DO. SO, YOU KNOW, GETTING OUR FOOT IN THE DOOR IN THE FIRST PLACE WAS SOMEWHAT DIFFICULT. BUT WE ARE THERE NOW. AND, ANOTHER CHALLENGE, A PRETTY BIG ONE HAS BEEN

TURNOVER IN SCHOOLS.

WE ARE SMALL COMMUNITY, NOT PARTICULARLY WELL

FUNDED IN THE SCHOOLS.

SO TEACHERS, ADMINISTRATORS, COUNSELORS, DON'T LAST VERY LONG.

QUITE OFTEN. SO ONCE YOU GET UP, YOU KNOW, WHEN WE STARTED WE HAVE A POINT PERSON AT EACH SCHOOL THAT HELPED US GET IN AND ONCE THAT PERSON LEAFS, YOU HAVE TO START ALL OVER AGAIN.

SOMETIMES IN THE MIDDLE OF THE SCHOOL YEAR. SO, WE HAVE WORKED REALLY HARD TO, TO TRAIN AND TALK TO MORE OF A DIVERSE CROSS SECTION OF EACH SCHOOL.

ACTUALLY, THE STUDENTS HAVE HELPED WITH THE SUSTAINABILITY IMMENSELY.

ONCE THEY ARE ON BOARD AND ONCE THEY HAVE BECOME EDUCATED AND LEADERS AND THEY ARE THE ONES THAT GO TO SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS AND SAY THAT THEY WANT US TO COME IN.

THEY WANT US TO COME BACK.

SO THAT HAS BEEN INTERESTING. SO THOSE ARE SOME OF THE CHALLENGES THAT WE FACE AND I CAN TALK ABOUT THE OPPORTUNITIES THAT ARE UNIQUE TO RURAL AREAS COMING FROM A CITY TO THIS PLACE.

YOU KNOW, WE, WE'RE SMALL HERE, WE TEND TO KNOW A LOT OF PEOPLE.

OUR CONNECTIONS ARE VERY, ARE EASIER. YOU KNOW, LIKE I SAID, EARLIER, OUR NEIGHBORS, OUR TEACHERS, WE HAVE YOUTH SERVING ORGANIZATIONS AND

THERE IS A REALLY GREAT ATTITUDE TOWARDS THE YOUTH IN OUR COMMUNITIES.

THE SCHOOLS ARE THE HEARTS OF THE TOWN.

SO, YOU KNOW, TO GET TO STUDENTS AND HAVE THEM DEVELOP LEADERSHIP SKILLS, PEOPLE ARE VERY, VERY SUPPORTIVE OF THAT. IN RURAL COMMUNITIES AND IT IS EASIER TO HOLD PEOPLE IN SCHOOLS ACCOUNTABLE. THERE IS A FUNNY SORT OF COMPETITION BETWEEN OUR 31 RURAL SCHOOLS, YOU KNOW, IF WE TALK TO ONE SCHOOL AND SAY, WELL, WE DID THIS BIG EVENT AND WE DID THIS. YOU KNOW. PRESENTATION AT BELL FRIDAY HIGH SCHOOL AND IT WAS SO GREAT. AND THIS IS THE KID'S REACTION TO IT. THEY TEN TO SAY. OH. OKAY. WE NEED TO DO THAT HERE. AND, ESPECIALLY IF WE COVER IT IN THE MEDIA WHICH IS ALSO A BENEFIT OF BEING IN A RURAL AREA, OUR B ACCESS TO THE AREA. WE CAN WRITE ARTICLE FORCE LOCAL PAPER THAT COMES OUT WEEKLY, PRETTY MUCH ANY TIME WE WANT. THAT IS EXTREMELY FORTUNATE. SO, YOU KNOW, WHEN WE COVER OUR SCHOOL EVENTS, OTHER SCHOOLS SEE IT. OTHER COMMUNITIES SEE IT. WHICH I THINK THAT IS WHY OUR PROGRAM HAS SPREAD TO TWO OTHER COUNTIES. NOW THE BILLINGS GAZETTE HAS COVERED US QUITE FREQUENTLY BECAUSE BILLINGS HAS LACKED IN THE PREVENTION PROGRAMS. NEW SPEAKER: THAT IS A REALLY GOOD TIP. TRACY SAID IT VERY WELL. ONE OF THE ADVANTAGES THAT EVERYONE KNOWS EVERYONE. AND ONE OF THE DISADVANTAGES IS THAT EVERYONE KNOWS EVERYONE. DURING THAT EXPERIENCE. THAT MEDIA EXAMPLE, I GUESS THERE WERE TIMES WHEN IN RURAL COMMUNITIES YOU ARE SUBJECTED TO THE NON-RURAL MEDIA AND YOU REALLY HAVE NO CONTROL OVER IT. IN A COMMUNITY LIKE YOURS, MAN, I'M STRUCK BY HOW

MANY NEWSPAPERS ARE CLOSING NOW.

BUT AS LONG AS THEY STAY OPEN, YOU KNOW, THAT YOU DO HAVE THAT SPECIAL OPPORTUNITY AND MAYBE, YOU KNOW, AS WE WATCHED THEM CLOSE IN ADDITION TO TRYING TO KEEP NEWSPAPERS ALIVE, THERE IS ALSO THE QUESTION OF ALTERNATIVE MEDIA AND THINKING ABOUT WHAT THE COMMUNITY, WHETHER IT IS THE COMMUNITY WEB OR WHATEVER, BUT LOOKING AT THOSE NEW LEADERSHIP ACTIVITIES AND CREATIVE ON A NATIONAL LEVEL IN MAKING SURE THAT PREVENTION CONNECTION IS ONE STEP AHEAD OF WHAT MANY PEOPLE ARE AWARE OF IN TERMS OF TECHNOLOGY. I THINK THERE ARE SOME RURAL OPPORTUNITIES AS WELL THERE.

ANY OF THAT COME UP FOR YOU AS WELL IN TERMS OF THE WORK YOU ARE DOING, LEA? ANY STUFF YOU ARE DOING, VIA INTERNET, CONNECTIONS FOR MONTANA OR ANYTHING LIKE THAT?

NEW SPEAKER: WELL, I CAN SHOW A SLIDE.

I JUST, WE HAVE WORKED REALLY HARD ON OUR NEW TEAM DATING VIOLENCE PREVENTION WEB SITE. 32 NEW SPEAKER: PERFECT.

NEW SPEAKER: AND WE HAVE, YOU KNOW, TEENS HAVE REALLY BEEN INVOLVED IN THIS. WE HAVE WORKED WITH, WE ARE DEVELOPING OUR FIRST FACEBOOK PAGE. AND OUR TEAMS ARE ALL ON THEIR SOCIAL NETWORKING SITES.

WE COMMUNICATED WITH THEM A LOT. WE ARE, WE ARE PRETTY NEW TO DEVELOPING OUR INTERACTION BASED ON LINE AND WITH NEW TECHNOLOGY.

WE ARE, YOU KNOW, COVERING A LOT OF TECHNOLOGY. NEW SPEAKER: I WONDER WHETHER THE SOCIAL NETWORKING IDEAS ARE WAYS TO ENGAGE YOUTH AS LEADERS.

WHETHER THEY ARE WAY TO SAY TO YOUNG PEOPLE, HEY, YOU UNDERSTAND THESE ISSUES BETTER THAN WE DO AND MAYBE TO FORM A WORKING GROUP OR AD HOC COMMITTEE OR SOMETHING, SO PEOPLE HAVE AN EXPERIENCE AT DOING SOMETHING IN AWAY THAT IT IS NOT LIKE THEY ARE GOING TO LEARN FROM YOU.

EVEN THOUGH THEY SAY, SOMEWHAT YOUNG AND A LOT OLDER THIS THEIR PERSPECTIVE, THAN YOU ARE, YOU KNOW, YOU KNOW, MORE BROADLY.

BUT, HERE IS AN AREA WHERE THEY CAN BE MOST

KNOWLEDGEABLE AND CHANCE FOR TASTE OF LEADERSHIP.

NEW SPEAKER: YES, I AGREE WITH THAT. WE HAVE

STUDENTS WHO ARE NOT NECESSARILY GOING TO BE THE

ONES THAT STAND UP AND PRESENT TO A CLASS.

DEFINITELY MORE TECHNOLOGICALLY ORIENTED. AND DO ENJOY THIS KIND OF DEVELOPMENT.

NEW SPEAKER: EXCELLENT.

NEW SPEAKER: YEAH.

A COUPLE OF QUESTIONS HAVE COME UP IN TERMS OF CURRICULUM.

IN TRAININGS. IS THERE A PARTICULAR CURRICULUM OR SET OF TRAININGS THAT YOU USE WITH THE YOUNG PEOPLE IN YOUR COMMUNITY?

NEW SPEAKER: WE PULL FROM A LOT OF DIFFERENT CURRICULUMS.

I WOULDN'T SAY THAT WE USE ONE MORE THAN MOST. WE USE MENTORS AND VIOLENCE PREVENTION SAFE DATES.

HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS. I'M TRYING TO THINK. WE HAVE A WIDE VARIETY REACHING AND TEACHING TEENS. SOME OF THEM, I HAVE BEEN TRYING TO WATCH THE TEXT CHAT A LOT.

A LOT OF THEM HAVE COME UP.

I WOULD SAY, YOU KNOW, MY EXPERIENCE, A LOT OF CURRICULUM, VIOLENCE PREVENTION CURRICULA HAS PREVENTION, A LOT IS SECONDARY AND TERTIARY PREVENTION. 33 SO I TRY TO PULL AND DEVELOP THE CURRICULA ON PRIMARY PREVENTION. THE OTHER EXPERIENCE I HAVE HAD, IS THAT OUR COMMUNITIES, YOU KNOW, OUR RURAL AND A LOT OF VIOLENCE PREVENTION CURRICULA IS URBAN BASED AND SO WE HAVE DONE SOME, YOU KNOW, SHIFTING AND ACTIVITIES IN JUST MAKING THE MORE RELATABLE. SO OUR YOUTH AND WE HAVE DONE SOME SURVEYS WITH YOUTH AND WE DO A LOT OF EVALUATION SO THAT WE ARE MEETING OUR COMMUNITY WHERE THEY ARE AT AND

EFFECTIVE.

ACTIVITIES.

NEW SPEAKER: IN THE CURRICULUMS, YOU MENTIONED, AS YOU SAY, IT IS HARD TO EVEN GET A, A KEY ELEMENTS THAT ARE PRIMARY PREVENTION. ARE THERE ANY PIECES THAT STAND OUT THAT ARE REALLY MORE THAN JUST INFORMATION AND EDUCATION? BUT LEADERSHIP ORIENTED? THAT REALLY START TO, YOU KNOW, GET AT THAT ISSUE THAT COMES UP A LOT TODAY OF YOUTH LEADERSHIP?

NEW SPEAKER: YOU KNOW, I, I GUESS I WOULD SAY THAT I HAVE DEVELOPED MY OWN YOUTH LEADERSHIP KIND OF CURRICULA, BASED ON MY TRAINING IN YOUTH DEVELOPMENT. AND MADE IT PRIMARY PREVENTION ORIENTED.

SO I GUESS WHAT I AM SAYING, I TEACH TEAM BUILDING AND PUBLIC SPEAKING SKILLS AND ADVOCACY SKILLS TO THE YOUTH WHO ARE LEADERS. BEFORE THEY BECOME PRESENTERS OR BEFORE THEY BECOME LEADERS ON THE STEERING COMMITTEE.

THOSE SKILLS ARE BASED ON PROGRAMS THAT I HAVE

DONE IN THE PAST AND I GUESS I DON'T HAVE A

SPECIFIC VIOLENCE PREVENTION.

IF ANYONE HAS ONE, I WOULD LOVE TO SEE ONE.

NEW SPEAKER: WE WOULD LOVE FOR YOU TO THINK ABOUT THAT, TOO.

NEW SPEAKER: I CAN DO THAT.

I CAN DO THAT.

PULLING TO WHAT I --

NEW SPEAKER: SOME OF THE CONNECTIONS WITH THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, I WANT TO RAISE THIS ISSUE AND SEE IF MAYBE THEY CAN MAYBE PUT TOGETHER SOME SORT OF WORKING GROUP OR SOMETHING LIKE THAT.

THAT FOCUSES ON LEADERSHIP AND PERHAPS A WORKING GROUP ON YOUTH, PERHAPS A WORKING GROUP ON RURAL, REALLY STARTS.

BECAUSE I THINK WE ARE FEW YEARS OUT EVEN FROM WHEN WE HAVE BEEN DOING THE PREVENTION CONNECTION SERIES.

SO MUCH MORE WISDOM DEVELOPED WITH PEOPLE LIKE 34 YOU NOW HAVING HAD SOME REALLY STRONG EXPERIENCE.

AND IT IS TIME TO CAPTURE THAT. AND, YOU KNOW,

GET ON TO THE NEXT LEVEL OF CAPACITY.

THIS HAS BEEN REALLY, REALLY GREAT. WHAT I WOULD

LIKE TO DO NOW, HAVE YOU STAY ON AS A KEY PERSON

IN ANSWERING QUESTIONS AND RESPONDING TO COMMENTS

AND I THINK THAT WE'LL DO IT TWO WAYS.

IF PEOPLE WANT TO CHAT IN, FEEL FREE.

WE WANT TO ASK PEOPLE TO RAISE YOUR HANDS AND IF

YOU RAISE YOUR HANDS, WE'LL OPEN UP THE PHONE LINE.

I LIKE IT MUCH BETTER TO HEAR MORE VOICES.

PEOPLE HAVE A QUESTION OR A BRIEF COMMENT, WE HAVE MORE BEFORE THEY FINALIZE. NEW SPEAKER: WHILE PEOPLE ARE RAISING THEIR HANDS. OPEN UP THE PHONE LINES. WE CAN ASK A QUESTION OF LEA, LARRY, DAVID, MYSELF. LEA, LET ME ASK YOU, WHERE DO WE NEED TO GO IN THE MOVEMENT? IN TERMS OF LEADERSHIP? TO CONTINUE TO MOVE THIS WORK FORWARD? I CAN SAY, ONE SENIOR GRADUATING THIS YEAR WHO DID 200 HOURS OF INTERNSHIP WITH US THIS YEAR. AND ALREADY, AT HER COLLEGE, THAT SHE HASN'T GONE TO YET, STARTED WORKING WITH HER SEXUAL ASSAULT PROGRAM.

I THINK, DEVELOPING THAT KIND OF ENERGY IS, IS WHERE WE NEED TO BE.

I THINK OUR COMMUNITY, YOU KNOW, I THINK ALSO THE CROSS SECTION OF COMMUNITY LEADERS ARE REALLY IMPORTANT.

DIVERSE CROSS SECTIONS SO THAT WE ARE MEETING THE NEEDS OF EVERYONE IN THE COMMUNITY AND NOT JUST FOCUSSING ON A SPECIFIC POPULATION AND SPECIFIC GROUP OF PEOPLE.

NEW SPEAKER: OKAY.

GREAT.

NEW SPEAKER: WE HAD A HAND HERE.

I THINK IT IS ANDREA.

ANDREA, AND COULD YOU JUST PRESS STAR ONE AND

THAT WILL OPEN UP YOUR PHONE, ANDREA.

NEW SPEAKER: PRESS STAR ONE.

>> YOU DID IT.

ANDREA.

NEW SPEAKER: PLEASE PRESS STAR ONE. 35 NEW SPEAKER: I SEE SHE RAISED HER QUESTION IN THE TEXT CHAT.

NEW SPEAKER: THERE IT IS. HOW DO WE ADDRESS VIOLENCE AGAINST GAY TEEN COUPLES IN CITIES LIKE AUSTIN THAT ARE KNOWN TO BE VERY TOLERANT OF HOMOSEXUALITY? THAT IS A GREAT QUESTION.

LEA, DO YOU DEAL WITH LESBIAN, GAY, TRANSGENDER ISSUES IN THE WORK YOU DO?

NEW SPEAKER: YES. AS FAR AS PRIMARY PREVENTION D GOES, WE TRY TO ADDRESS, WE TALK A HOT OF GENDER AND DEBUNKING TRADITIONAL GENDER VIEWS AND HELPING YOUTH TO DEVELOP THEIR OWN IDENTITIES WITH CONFIDENCE. NOT BASED ON STRICT GENDER RULES.

WE HAVE APPLIED FOR FUNDING BUT HAVE NOT BEEN ABLE TO FOCUS OUR ATTENTION ON THAT.

SO WE HAVE AN ASPECT OF IT IN ALL OF OUR PRIMARY PREVENTION PROGRAMS.

THAT IS ONE OF THE GOALS TO BE ABLE TO FOCUS MORE ON THAT. I THINK, WE DO A LOT OF THAT, WHEN WE DO SEXUAL HARASSMENT PREVENTION, TOO. SO IT DEF FITLY TRYING TO ADDRESS IT.

BUT I DON'T FEEL LIKE WE ARE AT THE LEVEL THAT WE SHOULD BE AT.

NEW SPEAKER: BUT THAT IS A GREAT QUESTION.

NEW SPEAKER: THAT REALLY WAS.

NEW SPEAKER: DAVID, ARE YOU SEEING ANYMORE

QUESTIONS OUT THERE?

NEW SPEAKER: I'M SEEING INTERESTING DISCUSSION ABOUT THE CYCLE OF ABUSE.

WE HAVE A LOT OF INTERESTING CONVERSATIONS GOING ON THAT ARE ADDRESSING THIS.

IF ANYONE CAN TALK ABOUT HOW TO BE ABLE TO

ADDRESS THE ISSUES OF ABUSE AND SAME SEX

RELATIONSHIPS NOW, WOULD BE REALLY GREAT TO TALK ABOUT.

BROADENING THE CURRENT LEADERSHIP STRUCTURE,

WHERE DO YOU SEE THOSE OPPORTUNITIES AND HOW DO WE CAPITALIZE ON THEM?

NEW SPEAKER: WELL, I MEAN, I THINK IN OUR

COMMUNITY AND I THINK NATIONALLY, ONE OF THE

OPPORTUNITIES IS TO SPREAD BEST PRACTICES AND

TALK ABOUT, LIKE WE ARE DOING RIGHT NOW.

I THINK THAT. YOU KNOW. REALLY EVALUATING YOUR

PROGRAM SO YOU KNOW WHAT WORKS AND WHAT DOESN'T

WILL HELP OTHER LEADERS BE SUCCESSFUL. IT IS

REALLY HARD TO KEEP REINVENTING THE WHEEL.

I THINK IF WE KEEP TALKING AND WORKING TOGETHER,

AND, YOU KNOW, SHARING OUR PROGRAMS, AND, THAT IS A REALLY BIG OPPORTUNITY FOR ALL OF US TO DEVELOP OUR LEADERSHIP. AND TO HAVE MORE TO GIVE TO OUR COMMUNITIES. AND TO FOLLOW THROUGH IS HUGE, YOU KNOW.

MAKING SURE THAT WE CAN FOLLOW THROUGH ON WHAT WE SAY WE ARE GOING TO DO IN THIS MOVEMENT.

NEW SPEAKER: LET ME ASK ONE MORE QUESTION, LEA. BECAUSE, CLEARLY, HAVE YOU EMERGED AS A LEADER IN THIS WORK AND ON THIS CALL.

AS A LEADER, WHAT DO YOU NEED? WHAT WOULD HELP YOU FEEL BOTH MORE EFFECTIVE AND ALSO MORE SUPPORTIVE?

NEW SPEAKER: FUNDING IS VERY KEY. AND I SAW THAT A LOT. I APOLOGIZE, I DIDN'T ANSWER ONE OF THE QUESTIONS THAT CAME UP EARLIER.

IT IS HARD TO FIND THAT.

IT IS HARD TO COVER ALL OF YOUR BASES PULLING FROM DIFFERENT CURRICULA.

I THINK THAT NEEDS TO BE DEVELOPED MORE. AND I THINK, YOU KNOW, AS WE ENGAGE, IT WILL ONLY HELP OUR LEADERSHIP.

SO, I THINK TOOLS IN THAT, TOOLS IN LIKE

DEVELOPING, TALKING LEADERSHIP DEVELOPING IN YOUTH, TOOLS TO SPARK MOTIVATION IN MEN TO BECOME LEADERS NOT JUST ENGAGING THEM IN SMALL EVENS. YOU KNOW, YOU KNOW, WHAT ARE OTHER PEOPLE DOING THAT IS SUCCESSFUL? THAT HELPS. NEW SPEAKER: AND LET ME ASK THAT QUESTION MORE BROADLY FOR A COUPLE OF MINUTES, TURN THIS INTO A TEXT CHAT. WHAT IS NEEDED TO DEVELOP AND SUSTAIN 37 **DIVERSE VIOLENCE AND PREVENTION.** VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN PREVENTION MOVEMENT LEADERSHIP IN YOUR COMMUNITY. MORE SPECIFICALLY, WHAT DO EACH OF YOU ON THE PHONE NEED? WHAT ARE THE THINGS THAT YOU FEEL LIKE WOULD BE HELPFUL TO YOU. IT DOESN'T HAVE TO BE TOOLS AND RESOURCES STRATEGIES. IT CAN BE --NEW SPEAKER: RESEARCH. THE EVIDENCE BASED. NEW SPEAKER: PEOPLE. NEW SPEAKER: FUNDING WILL COME UP A LOT. NEW SPEAKER: ROB. WHAT DO YOU MEAN BY PEOPLE? WHAT DO YOU NEED FROM PEOPLE? OR WHAT KIND OF PEOPLE? IF YOU WANT TO RAISE YOUR HAND AND ANSWER THAT, THAT WOULD BE GREAT, TOO. OR PRESS STAR ONE. NEW SPEAKER: MORE COMMUNITY MEMBERS ON BOARD. NEW SPEAKER: ROB, PRESS STAR 1 AND SHOULD BE ABLE TO UNMUTE YOUR PHONE. MAYBE IT IS JUST NOT WORKING WELL TODAY. NEW SPEAKER: GREAT. NEW SPEAKER: THERE YOU ARE. NEW SPEAKER: YEAH, HEY, I WAS THINKING, WHAT I WOULD REALLY LIKE TO SEE IS PEOPLE IN THE ORGANIZATIONS THAT WE ARE WORKING IN REALLY

INVEST IN OUR WORK AND WORKING WITHIN, LET'S SAY

THE SCHOOLS, IF PEOPLE IN THE SCHOOLS WERE REALLY EXCITED ABOUT US COMING IN AND WANTED TO SEE, FIND OUT WAY FORCE THEM TO CONTINUE THAT CONVERSATION, I FEEL LIKE THAT WOULD DO A LOT OF GOOD WORK AND, HELPING TO CHANGE THE CULTURE OF OUR SCHOOL OR THE CULTURE OF AN ORGANIZATION. IF THERE WERE PEOPLE IN THERE WHO AFTER WE LEFT AND WE DID OUR PROGRAMS, IF THERE WERE WORKING TO KEEP THAT CONVERSATION GOING. THAT WOULD BE BENEFICIAL.

NEW SPEAKER: I JUST WANT TO MAKE, ASHLEY SAID, WHAT SHE WOULD LIKE TO BE TRAINED IN HOW TO RUN FOR OFFICE.

I THINK THAT ALL NOTION OF, YOU KNOW, SOME OF US THINKING ABOUT POLITICS OR SOME OF US THINKING ABOUT LEADERSHIP ROLES, WHERE WE ARE FEELING NOT ENOUGH LEADERS, MAYBE STEPPING UP TO DO THAT IS AN INTERESTING IDEA.

FUNDINGS OBVIOUSLY COME UP A LOT. ALSO, THIS NOTION OF PEOPLE WHICH I THINK THAT WE HAVE TOUCHED ON A LOT TODAY, LIZ.

NEW SPEAKER: AND I HAVE SEEN MEDIA RUN THROUGH A LOT, STRONGER RELATIONSHIPS WITH MEDIA AND MEDIA 38 THAT DOESN'T REINFORCE THE NORMS THAT WE ARE TRYING TO KIND OF DISMANTLE A LITTLE BIT. NEW SPEAKER: MONEY IS COMING UP A LOT. I THINK THIS MAY BE A TIME, YOU KNOW, THAT OBVIOUSLY IS A

CHANGING ADMINISTRATION IN WASHINGTON. THERE HAS BEEN MORE RESOURCE TALKED ABOUT FOR SECONDARY AND TERTIARY ISSUES.

I THINK THIS MAY BE A TIME FOR US TO RAISE OUR VOICE.

HOPEFULLY, WILL BE THINKING ABOUT THAT 0 OVER THE

NEXT FEW MONTHS.

SOME CASES IT MAY NOT BE SOMETHING THAT WILL BE A FEDERALLY SUPPORTED, YOU KNOW, MEDIA SESSION LIKE THIS. BUT I THINK THERE ARE WAYS THAT IT IS TIME FOR US TO SAY, HEY, WAIT A MINUTE, WHY DON'T WE PREVENT THIS IN THE FIRST PLACE.

MAYBE SOME EMERGING LEGISLATION EVEN WHERE WE CAN BUILD THAT FURTHER.

THERE IS THE MEDIA.

THERE IS THE RESOURCE AND CLEARLY, THE MATERIALS.

I THINK THAT IS A PLACE WHERE GROUPS LIKE CDC CAN'T HELP US.
