Sustainability Planning Process

- Start with the Building Blocks
- Develop a Shared Understanding of Sustainability
- Assess what we are doing now. What do we want to sustain?
- How will we get there? Planning and implementation



Sustainability Planning Process

- Assessment
 - Inventory of present program components
 - Decide on criteria for sustainability
 - Having an impact? (Results justify continuing)
 - Costs and benefits?
 - Is there still a need?
 - Community support is strong
 - Potential funding

Sustainability Planning Process

- Planning
 - Four Approaches:
 - Institutionalization
 - Policy
 - Community ownership/community norm changes
 - Finding the resources

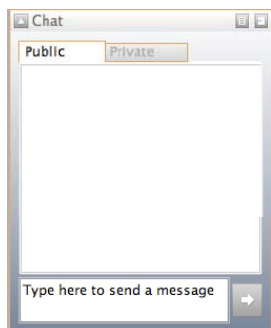

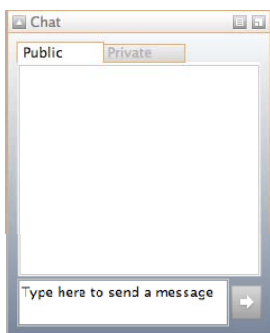

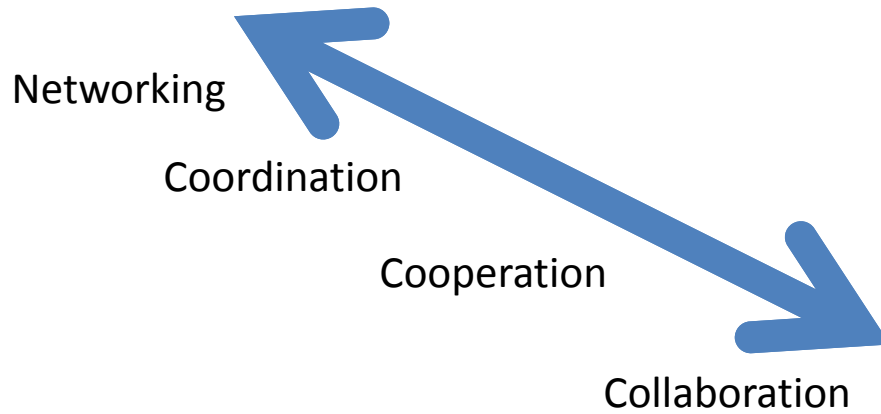

Collaboration

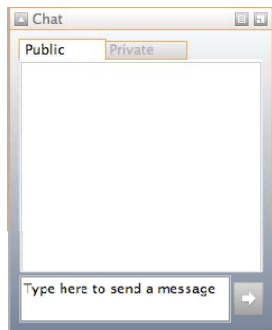
