Safe Supported Referral


- Prevention Educators may help youth contact relevant resources

Strengthening Individual Knowledge & Skills

- Clinicians and Advocates are providing anticipatory guidance on healthy relationships and reproductive coercion
- Over 4000 patient safety cards and 4000 red/ green flag cards have been distributed
- Clinics are hanging posters in their exam rooms on how violence affects a woman's health

Promoting Community Education

- Distributed 80 Nursing Resource Guides to medical assistants and 425 to Osteopathic doctors
- Have distributed nearly 1000 Teen Relationship Violence guides throughout the state.
- Pilot sites have completed trainings of additional partners in their local communities that included reproductive coercion
- ODVN newsletter and New Directions have highlighted Project Connect and reproductive coercion in their newsletters

Changing Organizational Practice

- Standardizing a conversation about relationships with teens rather than asking questions
- Mandatory training on reproductive coercion for all direct service staff
- Referral mechanism to the local health department for expedited referral

- Over 2,000 providers from over 50 clinical sites have received training, serving over 250,000 women and children
- Development of provider tools, guidelines, and 12 new training video vignettes

- Questions about reproductive coercion added to state PRAMS (VA, OH, GA)





- Adultism


