






# Developmental Stages/Responses





#### Key Messages About Sexuality in Scripture

#### Sexual Ethic for Adolescents

- Based on relationship qualities and social justice NOT act-based morality
- Relationships should be based on shared personal values, including:
  - C consensual,
  - U non-using, non-exploitative and non-coercive,
  - H honest,
  - M mutually pleasurable, and
  - P protected against unintended pregnancy and STIs.

#### Three Key Components of a Congregation Policy

- Policies and procedures for keeping all children safe from sexual abuse.
- Policies and procedures for educating the adults, youth, and children in the congregation about child sexual abuse and prevention.
- Developing policies and procedures for responding to a person who has been convicted or accused of sexual offenses against children.



- Support Groups for Survivors


