- WAVE programs through our university. We help them give sexual assault prevention presentations
- We have done candlelight vigils
- We do SA awareness events (Denim Day) as well as Dating Violence Awareness events.
- Our local crisis center has a campus prevention staff person who we partner with for programs and events
- Through campus health centers
- Trained university faculty/staff on working with survivors
- Presentations on dating violence/sexual assault
- co-sponsor events & training on our campus
- I work for a community group in teaching violence prevention to high school and college age students and I am having such a difficult time engaging our local university in working together!
- JWI is partnering with a national fraternity and sorority to bring a primary prevention program to "greek' students. We've piloted it on 3 campuses with plans to implement broadly over the next year.
- Great to see the partnerships with local centers.
- Georgia Legal Services has reached out to local colleges to conduct prevention/awareness programs, but it hasn't always been received well by the administration. It's sometimes tough to break into that world.
- We also partner with our Crisis Center for events and workshops.
- We invited Campus staff and legislative staff to our SART meeting to further discuss Campus Safety and legislation.
- Also making connection week greek community during their pledge and rush events , etc.

- We regularly partner with both on and off campus allies on events such as Take Back the Night, Denim Day, and others, and on trainings and ongoing education
- As I speak to campuses across the country, I see lots of central response teams that include reps and liasons from different constituents on and off campus - once a month and ongoing email conversation. Lots of folks are doing this.

- Preventing Sexual Violence on College Campuses
- Those coordinated response teams are critical. We often don't link that to prevention, but it is essential.
- I recently partnered with the ROTC on campus- is anyone else doing this on their campuses?
- I think creating/maintaining connections is key. Penn State's Center for Women Students does extensive programming throughout the year about sexual violence and other issues--work directly with fraternities/sororities, first-year student athletes, evening programs, etc. We are also in the midst of a Bystander Intervention task Force, which is looking at effective bystander intervention progams regarding a host of issues.

- If you are from a campus, I'd turn to your local programs and coalitions to answer many of these questions.
- But keep the questions coming - local centers and coalitions are often the best re: resources that you are asking about.
- Unclear as to why the CDC is in charge of a patriarchal problem of the normalization of male privilege and objectification of women. We need comprehensive empathy building and misogyny deconstruction for every male student.

- We are adapting the Stet UP bystander training out of U of A- we really like this model
- Nicole we use the Step Up program at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities. It's been very successful thus far.
- Traci we are rolling it out in the Fall in several versions so we are hopeful that it will be received well by the students
