





- Violence is preventable.
- Multiple forms of violence are interrelated.
- A violence prevention paradigm reflecting the interrelated nature of the problem and solutions has greater impact.

# Community Violence, Intimate Partner and Child Maltreatment

- Multiple forms of violence are
  - Share common underlying factors
  - Experienced together
  - Result in common outcomes
- Exposure to one form of violence increases risk of further victimization and engagement in violent behavior

# Community Violence, Intimate Partner and Child Maltreatment

- The historical players and unique expertise within each form of violence are different and can add value to an integrated, coordinated approach
- Response and intervention infrastructure is more developed than prevention infrastructure
- Societal perceptions about victims and perpetrators differ by forms of violence resulting in a bias toward the need for different types of solutions

# Community Violence, Intimate Partner and Child Maltreatment

- Contextual and experiential evidence is essential to better understanding linkages between multiple forms of violence and developing prevention strategies
- Addressing multiple forms of violence has challenges that must be overcome







#### Photovoice: Your Photos Tell The Story

Photovoice is a process by which people capture and record their life experiences and cultural experiences through photography and stories.





\$\text{\$\text{\$"What is Seen here?"} (Describe what the eye sees)}

Heart and a condom

H "What is really Happening?" (The unseen "story" behind the image)

Just because you're having sex doesn't mean he loves you

• "How does this relate to Our lives?" (Or MY life personally)

People tell others they love them just to have sex with them

W "Why are things this way?"

Some people will say anything just to get sex

E "How could this image Educate people?"

Use life examples of what true love is and what isn't love

U "What can I Do about it?" (What WILL I or WE do about it)

- Improve customer service and prevent family violence




