- Develop social change campaigns specific to this issue









Other "prevention" efforts


- Identifying and tracking sex offenders

Why is talking about sex important for prevention?

Sex is often eliminated from the conversation of CSA

It's the thing we don't want to teach kids about

What we shame people about

What we struggle to understand as survivors

Sex is the common denominator



Holistic Sexuality

Holistic Sexuality is the belief that the physical act of sex is but one part of human sexuality. The everexpanding whole of sexuality is interactive. Our ideas, experiences, identities, acts and feelings can stand, shift and flow. Sexual development, sexual health, reproductive health, interpersonal relationships, affection, understanding of power, intimacy, body image, abstinence, gender identity, understanding emotions, accountability, sexual orientation, communication, an understanding of sexuality historically and broader ideas of relationship configurations, are but some parts of holistic sexuality.

Holistic Sexuality

Holistic Sexuality information (HSI) is what we give to our children to prepare them for their journey's. It is a lifelong (ideological, internal, interpersonal and institutional) process of acquiring information and forming attitudes, beliefs, and values


Ignacio's Intentional Human Sexuality Model© 12HSM©



Encouraged by:

- Historically how one learns about sex
- The backlash associated with sexual taboos
- The ideology that there are those entitled/not entitled to have sex/be sexual or have intimacy







12HSM©

- Celebrates open communication
- Relationship building
- Teaching model for both adult and child
- Incorporates power and oppression
- Discourages secrecy



12HSM©

- Incorporates Sexual orientation including asexuality
- Discusses Trans, cis, intersex identities
- Goes beyond monogamy
- Lifelong journey



Think of this process as if you were a Mama bird-



"Feeding"





The process is about:

- Holistic Sexuality Information as a lifeskill
- Children having more power through knowledge
- Navigating the power of parents/guardians
- Eliminating the power of secrecy used by harm-doers
- And so much more...



Community Circles to Promote Children's Safety

- Training Youth Leaders in Circle Process
- Community Circles to address drug abuse, presence of gangs, school suspensions
- Circle to address conflicts between residents and to address incidents of harm
- Youth and caregiver community garden plots
- Community leaders involved in curriculum development of prevention curriculum


Barriers to Community Circles

- Confidentiality concerns when everybody knows everybody
- Fear of Retaliation
- Commitment to accountability
- Loss of housing
- Loss of Children



Strengths of Community Circles

- Adults are responsible and empowered to keep children safe
- Youth are trained to lead circles and make their safety needs known
- Community members develop means to resolve community disputes
- More members of the community are being trained in circle process
- Strong evaluation tools that document behavior change




Lideres Campesinas was born in the Coachella Valley over 30 years ago
