

Jeanine Weekes Schroer is a philosopher of race and feminist theory and an Associate Professor of philosophy at University of Minnesota Duluth and currently Head of the Department of Geography & Philosophy. Her teaching and research concern the ethics and politics of social oppression and its remedies. She co-edited the first philosophical volume on Microaggression -- *Microaggressions and Philosophy*. She has also published on ethics in public discourse around racism and sexism, narrative ethics in scientific discourse around racism, ethics and politics around race and gender in philosophy, narrative constructions of personal identity, and experimental philosophy. Schroer is also committed to support her community through volunteer work with the Junior League of Duluth; Program for Aid to Victims of Sexual Assault (PAVSA) (as current board chair); and Black Liberation Lab, an organization dedicated to supporting Black folk of Duluth in struggle for self-definition, rich and meaningful lives, and transformative healing from white supremacy (that she co-founded).
