- our member centers do prevention education in schools and are working on our new bystander intervention campaign.
- community workshops, train the trainer model
- PSA's and campaigns
- Healthy Relationships groups in middle schools
- we work with your on primary prevention specifically oppression and also work with their adult allys on adultism and their role in creating a respectful environment
- By starting new programs; we were fortunate enough to be a Green Dot pilot site, and hope to continue this program and expand it.
- We don't have prevention money so we can't do much. Have used Choose Respect and Safe Dates curriculum in schools.
- We have a men's prevention program called Men Standing Up.

- We do presentations in middle school, and other social service agencies including troubled youth and youth with disabilities
- we are trying to change community attitudes about DV with a community organizing project
- We have prevention americorps members who use safe dates in schools and community organizations like boys and girls club
- Parent Centers and gropus partnering with Sexual Assault Prevention
- We are just beginning a pilot program with teens using Green Dot - we are very excited.

- Implementing green Dot at three high schools now. Bringing the schools together to share resources/ideas
- Collaborating with PAWS who is presenting to our staff and parents about Violence in Klamath County
- We have partnered with a community school in the area which bridges the gap between the community, school, and local organizations. We offer several primary prevention programs as part of after school programs for high school students
- through boys and girls club, housing authorities, schools, family resource centers speaking on sexual assault prevention and domestic violence prevention

- Primary Prevention with clubs like My Strength and a female version called My Voice
- Our Domestic Violence Community Council and Sexual Assault Response Team which I facilitate bring intentional prevention talk into our discussions
- Our teen dating violence program info can be found at [www.repsc.org](http://www.repsc.org). Our work is mainly with high schools, but we would like to work more with parents, teachers, coaches, and middle schools
- We have shifted our language at United Way from addressing domestic violence to promoting healthy relationships
- Community Roundtables with community agencies
- As a member of the "public" I attended a video presentation workshop for Boy Scout parent and activity leaders which emphasized avoiding being alone with scouts.
- programming to teach college freshmen about relationship violence and sexual assault: what is it and how to protect yourself and friends.
- What is Green Dot?
- Talking about the costs of not preventing violence - particularly violence to children
- Bullying prevention is now mandated by NJ state law
- Green Dot is a curriculum focused on encouraging bystander intervention.
