

<u>Tool for Health and Resilience</u> <u>in Vulnerable Environments:</u>

- Focuses on the Social Determinants of Health
- A framework to develop local strategies to address poor health outcomes
- Emphasizes health equity especially, for communities of color.








THRIVE can help close the health gap by:

- Promoting the value of upstream approaches as an approach for equity
- Building community capacity while building on community strength
- Being a strategic planning tool at community and organizational levels
