



Trauma

- Experiences or situations that are emotionally painful
- Chronic adversity (discrimination, racism, sexism, poverty, oppression)

ACE Study

A collaborative effort by the Centers for Disease Control and the Kaiser Health Plan Department of Preventive Medicine in San Diego

- · Recurrent physical abuse
- Recurrent emotional abuse
- Contact sexual abuse
- An alcohol and/or drug abuser in household
- An incarcerated household member
- · Mother is treated violently
- One or no parents
- Emotional or physical

neglect

 A household member who is chronically depressed, mentally ill, institutionalized or suicidal


Synergistic Trauma

- The combination of individual trauma from exposures to violence and the trauma from exposures to structural violence.
