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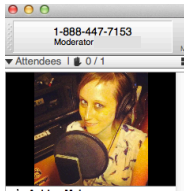

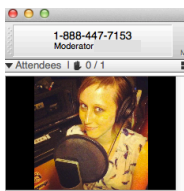

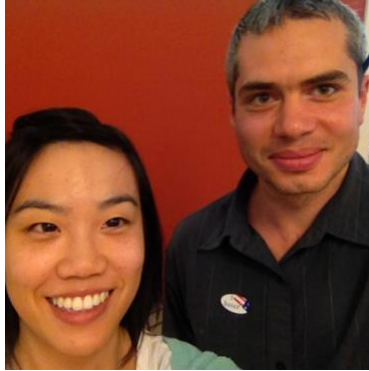

Linkages

Community Violence, Intimate Partner and Child Maltreatment

- Multiple forms of violence are
 - Share common underlying factors
 - Experienced together
 - Result in common outcomes

- Exposure to one form of violence increases risk of further victimization and engagement in violent behavior

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Barriers we Addressed

- Discomfort talking about isms and violence ✓
How do we help partners who are uncomfortable talking about isms or violence be a part of prevention work?

- Working across forms of violence is “issue or vision creep” ✓

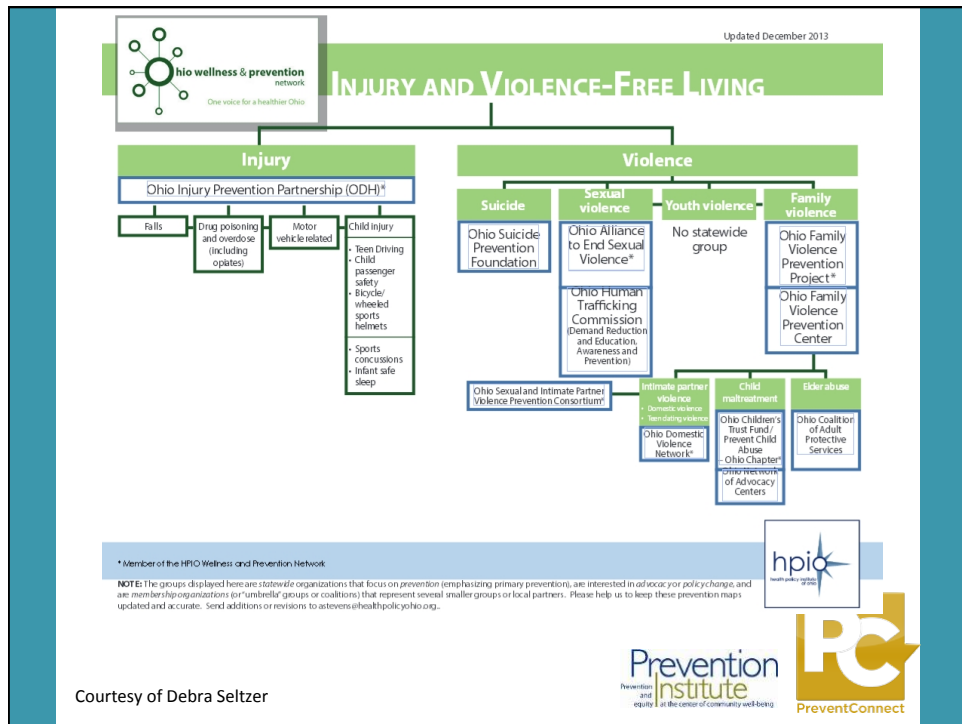

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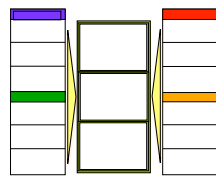

Applications

- Delineates similarities, differences, collective resources
- Promotes understanding about diverse partners, and supports relationship- and trust-building
- Fosters shared vision, goals and language
- Identifies collective strengths and missing expertise
- Establishes joint outcomes and strategies
- Clarifies the contributions and roles of each partner

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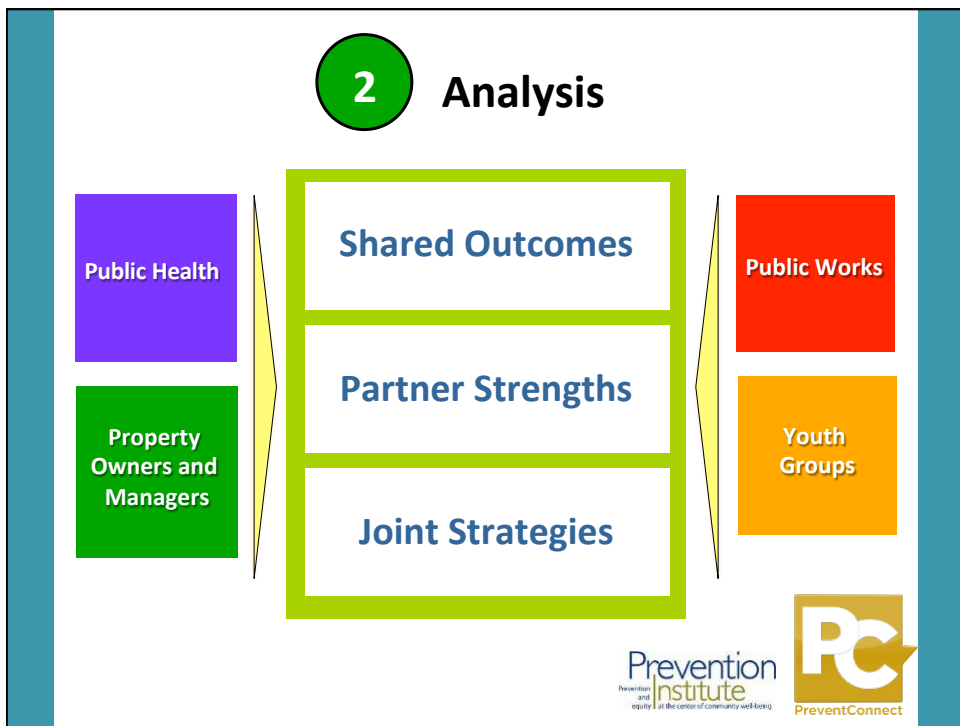
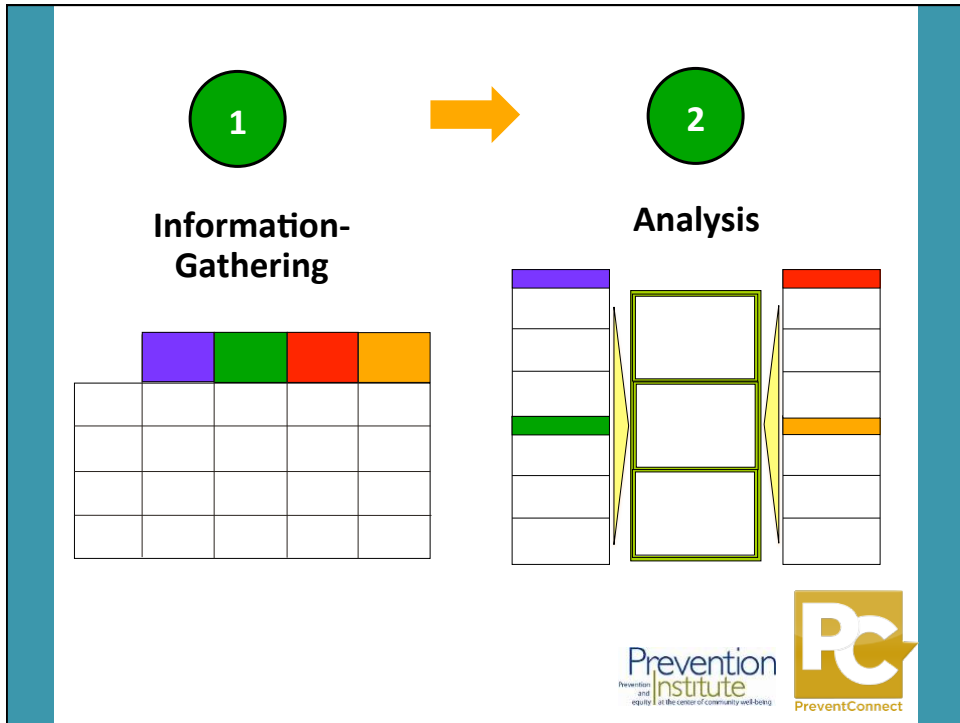

4. Unlearn the culture of violence

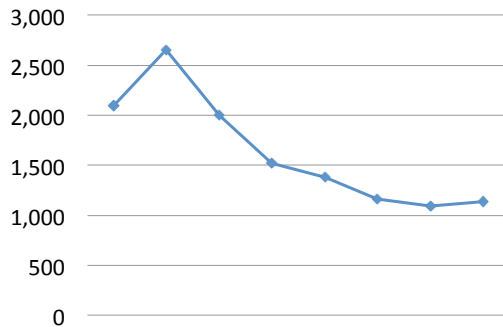
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Blueprint for Action

- 4x as many high school students with year-round jobs, internships
