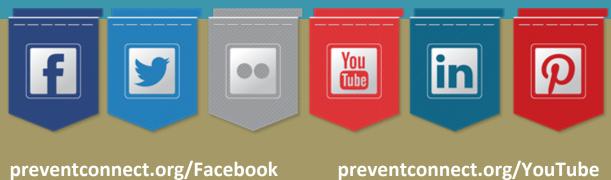
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



Pronouns

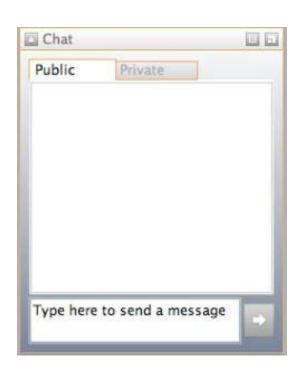
- Replaces a person's name when talking in the thirdperson

Gender Violence Fueled by Systemic Oppressions

Patriarchy, Racism Capitalism, and other **Systemic Oppressions**

 Dynamic systems of power and dominance where groups of people are oppressed based on gender

Government, Courts. Schools, Religious Institutions, and other

 May educate and enforce oppression and dominance. Families, Friends, and **Peers** – Influences us to accept discrimination (i.e. sexism), inequity (i.e. strict gender roles) or oppression.

Individuals - May choose to discriminate or use violence that is fueled by a dynamic system of power and dominance.









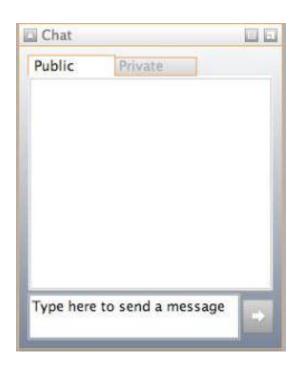
Areas of No Overlap


OPPOSE ANTI-TRANSGENDER LAWS!

LAS VEGAS — THIS week I will be sexually harassed on the job, and like many women in the Las Vegas service industry, I will count my tips at the end of my shift and decide that it is worth it.
