What messages should be sent to men to encourage them to be allies? To help intervene? What messages should be sent to perpetrators not to rape?
Identify 3 – 5 recommended strategies to address this issue/area of concern.




Reporting and Sexual Misconduct Policies & Procedures
What are reasons that students don't come forward to report?
What are students' perceptions of the judicial process? Of administrators? Of faculty? Staff? (Also: Who do you think of when we ask about administrators?)
Who on campus do you see as supportive entities and groups?
What do you know about the judicial process? What do you think is important for students to know to help them better understand the process and the system?
Do you think clarification or more education about the judicial process would increase reporting? Would clarification about the process change behavior? (e.g. reduce assaults, increase intervening, etc)?

Bystander Intervention

Bystander intervention is one method for preventing sexual assault. What are reasons that people don't intervene?
What situations do you think that students are least prepared to handle in relation to sexual violence?
Is there a difference between students' willingness to intervene in a potentially problematic situations if the people involved are strangers or acquaintances?
Have you attended a bystander intervention training? If so, what did you learn?
Do students know how to get involved in prevention efforts on campus? Are they familiar with student organizations involved in prevention and education?
What groups do we need to target for prevention initiatives?

Alcohol and Consent

What messages about alcohol and consent do students struggle with the most? What is most unclear to students about the relationship between alcohol and consent?
Educators have noticed that students tend to struggle the most with understanding alcohol and consent. What messages are currently shared by students on campus about alcohol and consent? What messages are shared by the University?
What are some effective campaign messages that would educate students about alcohol and consent?

Sexual Violence: Beyond Sexual Assault

Sexual violence encompasses domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, sexual harassment and sexual assault. What is your awareness of these issues on campus?
What do students think constitutes sexual violence?
What messages exist on campus about domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, sexual harassment and sexual assault?
In what ways do current campus resources, education and trainings address the different forms of sexual violence?
Are forms of sexual violence do you perceive to be overlooked by campus infrastructure (i.e. resources, education and trainings)? If so, which ones? If not, what suggestions do you have for education or prevention?

How can we best educate students on how to be supportive when friends disclose assault?
What messages/educational trainings do we need to help us teach students about how to support survivors? What to say and what not to say?
How do we better arm students with resources to share with survivors?
What resources do survivors need? Do you think the university adequately provides these resources?
