

Tips from Lynn and Beth in Ohio

- Since we have similar risk and protective factors as other oppressions, consider how we can reinforce our SDV prevention messages and address oppressions.
- Encourage people to find out about things they don't know about

- Consider each form of oppression as part of a larger system




