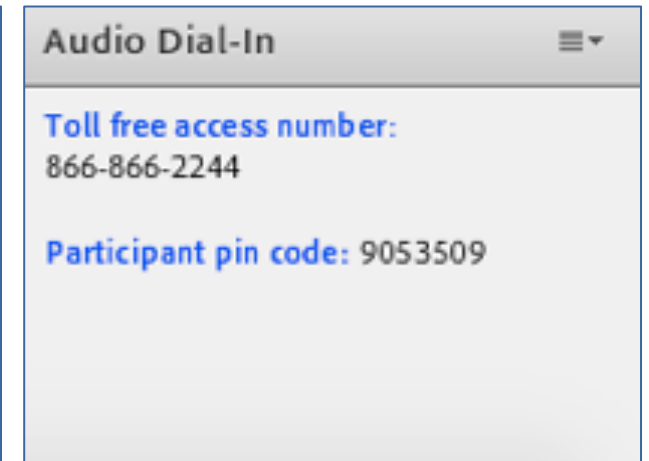
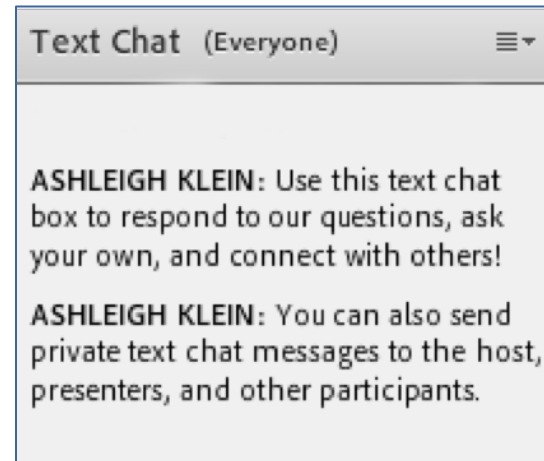

Coaching Boys Into Men Works!

- ▶ In a rigorous randomized control trial, funded by the CDC, CBIM has been proven to positively affect male athletes' bystander behaviors and to reduce abuse perpetration among athletes who receive the program, supporting the effectiveness of an athletics-based approach as one strategy to prevent dating violence among teens.

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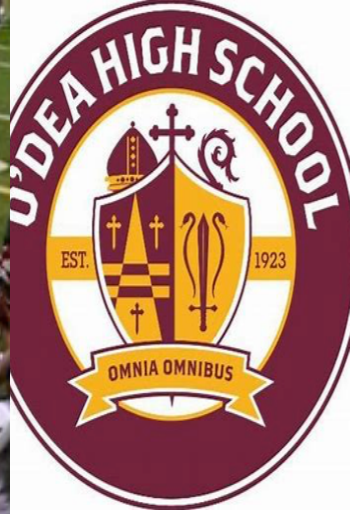


Athletes As Leaders Works!

- ▶ In a national evaluation using pre- and post- surveys with 12 teams in 8 states, athletes who completed the program had statistically significant changes in 3 key areas: 1) improved ability to identify abusive behaviors; 2) improved believe in gender equity; 3) increased self-image and confidence.

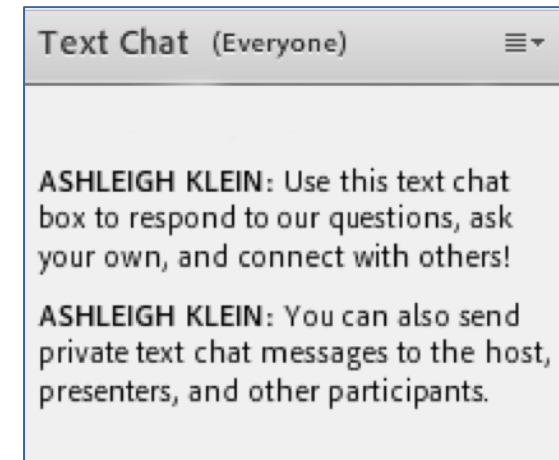

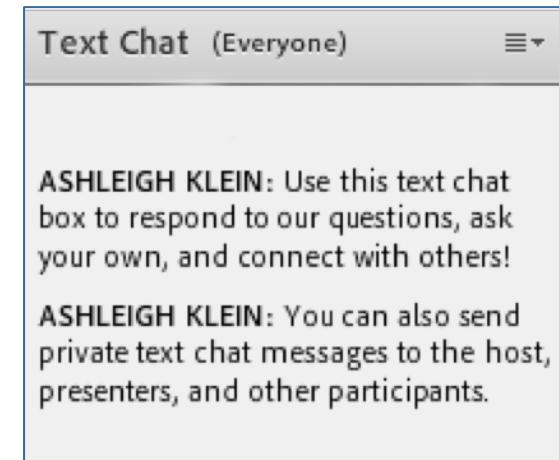

Working within athletics' framework in Iowa

Collaborated on CBIM pilot study with Futures Without Violence in 2008 (Iowa, Nebraska, South Dakota football coaches)
Established partnership with IHSAA in 2014
Cross-training between IHSAA and the Center for Violence Prevention – connecting “leadership” and “prevention.”
Promote training opportunities via IHSAA's social media reach (all athletic directors and principals in Iowa)



Getting Buy-in and Support from Coaches and Athletic Directors



Trust and Relationship with leadership at the Iowa High School Athletic Association Connect CBIM program outcomes to goals and values of each schools' extra-curricular activities and district goals. Personal concern(s) and hopes for the young men with whom they work. Leverage relationships with high-profile athletic directors and coaches to host trainings (coaches' video sessions).
