The community will design what the Health Equity Zone creates.



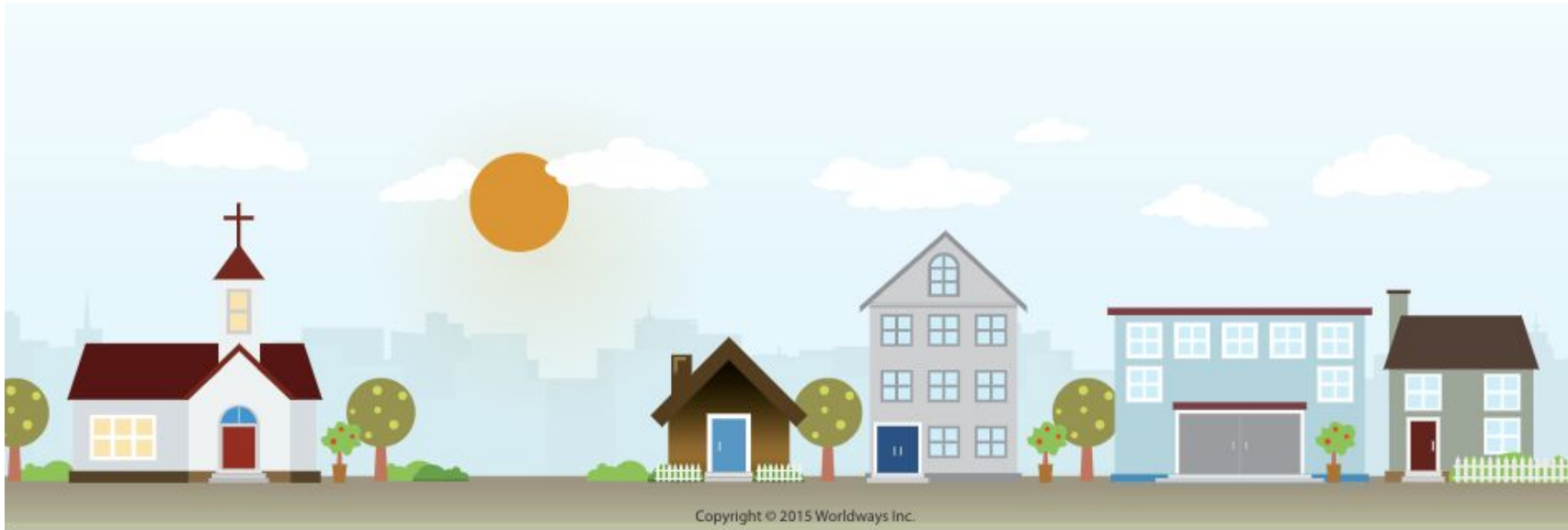

Everyone sits as equals when the Health Equity Zone convenes.



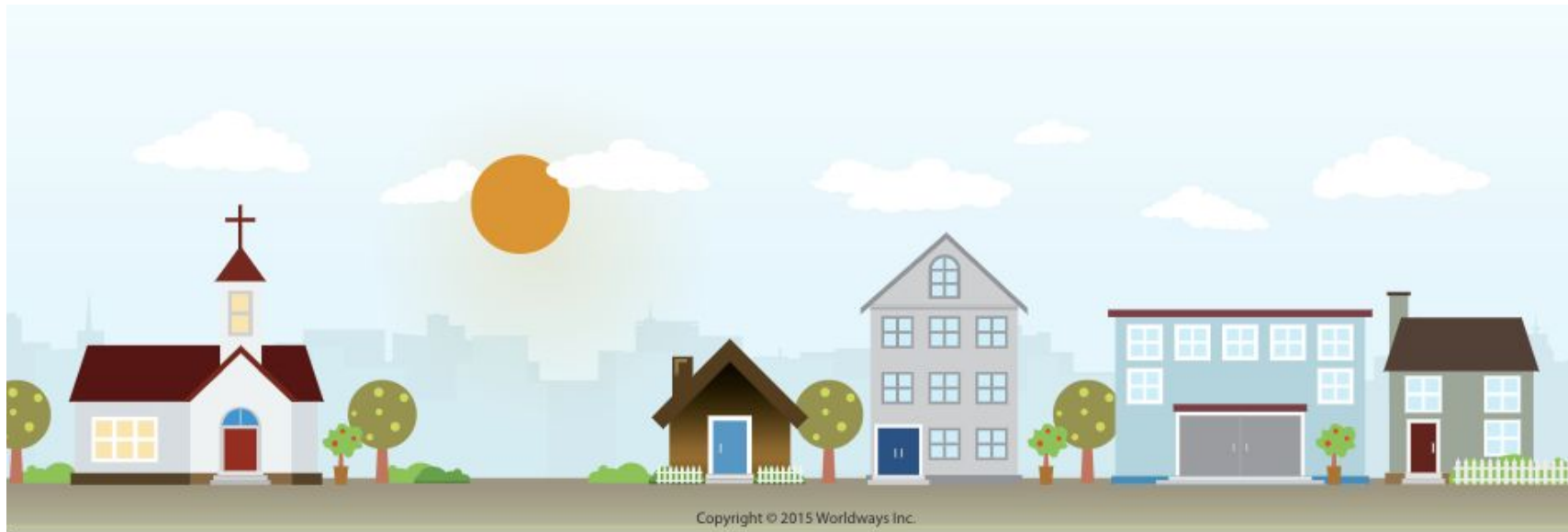

Equitable Economic Development



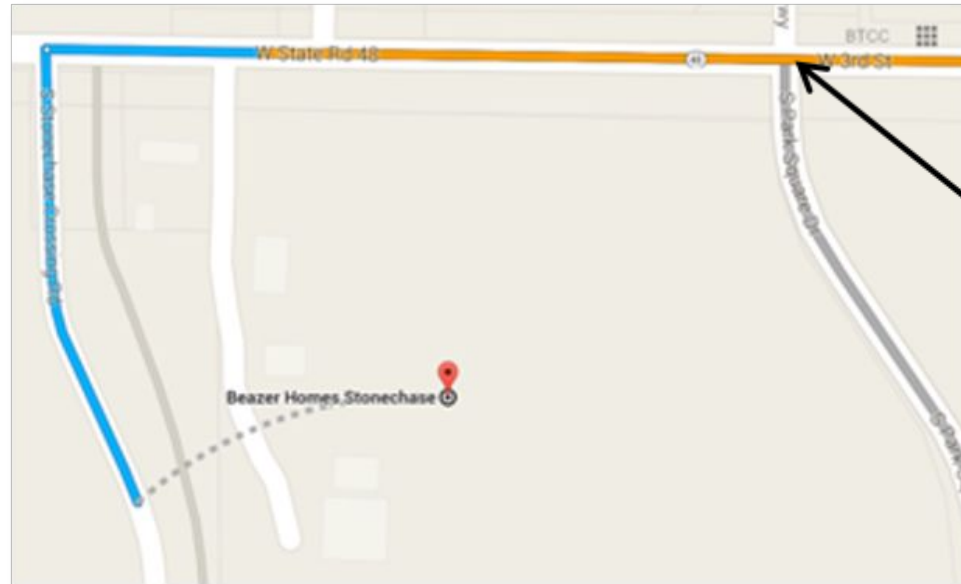




Outcomes
