





A GENERAL OVERVIEW OF THE PROJECT & TIMELINE

STAGE 01 (OCT 2022 - DEC 2022)

- Community Conversations & Focus Groups
- Consultant Advisory Team reviews current grant, grantees, strategies, impacts, etc.

STAGE 02 (JAN 2023 - MAR 2023)

- Share community responses to Advisory
- Consultant Advisory Team reviews input from Community & Grantees and identifies recurring themes
- SVP Program Team identifies grant strategies/priorities and gaps/needs with Advisory

STAGE 03 (APR 2023 - JUN 2023)

- Get-Ready/Skills Sessions - Grant Application 101 workshops
- Consultant Advisory Team reviews current application and gives feedback on improvements
- SVP Program Team reviews upcoming applications, with Advisory input and collaboration

FINAL STAGE (JUL 2023 - AUG 2023)

- Open SVP grant program RFA (request for applications) Through October 2023
- New Application out for Approval
- Recruit for Application Reviewers


Objectives
