Health Equity in Practice: Why Anti-Racism is an Integral Part of Sexual ...

Racial and Sexual Violence Pyramid

The pyramid is divided into four horizontal layers, each with a central title and surrounding examples:

- Death:** Adverse Childhood Experiences, Murder, Lynching, Genocide, Neglect in Healthcare.
- Violence:** Rape, Sexual Assault, Hate Crimes, Police Brutality, Physical Assault, Verbal Abuse.
- Institutional Discrimination:** Traditional Gender Roles, Gender Based Stereotypes, Racial Profiling, Reproductive Control, Funding, English Only Services, Judicial System, Homelessness, Prison Pipeline (abuse to-/school to-), Employment Discrimination, Healthcare, Red-lining, Mass Incarceration, Anti-immigration laws.
- Individual Acts of Prejudice:** Rape Jokes, Street harassment, Objectification, Racial Slurs, Racial Profiling, Cultural Appropriation, Problematic Language, Fetishism, Sexualized language, Victim Blaming, Micro-aggressions, Jokes.

Attitudes & Beliefs: "There are two sides to every story", "Belief people are better than others based on identity", "Forgiveness of perpetrator if white", "Not Believing POC/Survivor Experience(s)".

Sexual Violence: "Men can't get raped", "Boys will be boys", "Girls should stay home", "This could ruin their life", "She was asking for it".

Racial Violence: "All lives matter", "Not all white people", "I don't see color", "There is only one human race", "I can't be racist, I have a black friend".

White Supremacy

The belief that white people constitute a superior race and should therefore dominate society, typically to the exclusion or detriment of other racial and ethnic groups.

The diagram illustrates the flow from systems of oppression to various outcomes:

- Systems of Oppression:** Racism, Sexism, Ableism, Ageism, Classism, Heterosexism.
- Intermediate Factors:** Income and social protection, Working life conditions, Job security, Healthcare, Food security, Education, Early childhood development, Environmental and political conflict, Housing, Social Inclusion and non-discrimination.
- Outcomes:** Police Brutality, Sexual Violence, Pay Inequity, Harassment and discrimination, Housing Insecurity, Prison Industrial Complex, Poverty, Domestic Violence, Gentrification, Inequitable Wealth Distribution.

Health Equity in Practice: How to Transform field ...

A GENERAL OVERVIEW OF THE PROJECT & TIMELINE

The timeline is divided into four stages:

- STAGE 01 (OCT 2022 - DEC 2022):** Community Conversations & Focus Groups, Consultant Advisory Team reviews current grant, grantees, strategies, impacts, etc., Collect feedback from current grantees.
- STAGE 02 (JAN 2023 - MAR 2023):** Share community responses to Advisory, Consultant Advisory Team reviews input from Community & Grantees and identifies recurring themes, SVP Program Team identifies grant strategies/priorities and gaps/needs with Advisory.
- STAGE 03 (APR 2023 - JUN 2023):** Get-Ready/Skills Sessions - Grant Application 101 workshops, Consultant Advisory Team reviews current application and gives feedback on improvements, SVP Program Team reviews upcoming application, with Advisory input and collaboration.
- STAGE 04 (JUL 2023 - AUG 2023):** Open SVP grant program RFA (request for applications) Through October 2023, New Application out for Approval, Recruit for Application Reviewers.

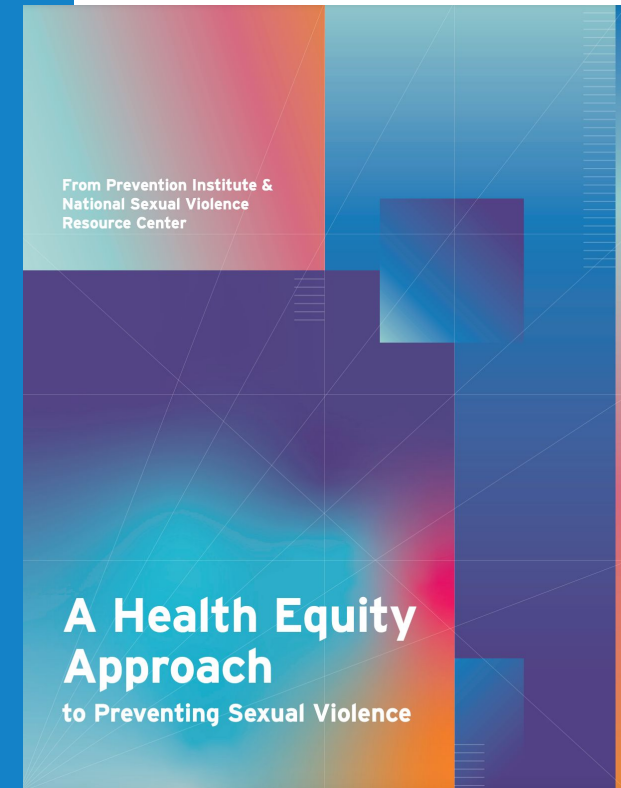
Objectives
